SAN RAFAEL, Calif., Aug. 8. (UP).—Tantalized by an accusation of grand theft, Mrs. Tantianno Helen Hull, 44, society woman, has deserted her home, leaving a note that she intended to drown herself, local police revealed today.

"I am too humiliated to live any longer," she said in the note left for her husband last Wednesday. "I intend to find a quiet place along the ocean and swim as far out as possible and drown."

Mrs. Hull was recently accused of stealing \$2000 worth of furniture from the home of a neighbor. She denied the allegations and police, doubting her guilt, had her bail set at the low figure of \$50.
