Allison to Medford—

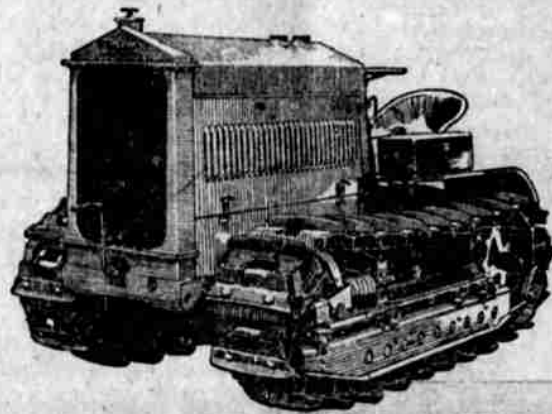
Rev. V. K. Allison, pastor of the First Christian church left this morning by motor for Medford on a brief business visit.
