Two Miles of Logging Road Is Completed

(Special To The Herald)
LAKEVIEW, August 17.—The Pelican Bay Lumber company has completed two miles of railroad south east of Bly and is now building into township 38, S. R. 15 East.
With this Klamath Falls concern building a line to tap timber which lies partly in Lake county, and with reports of the Ewasua Box company negotiating for the Booth tract, which lies largely in Lake county, much of the Lake county timber will be logged here and shipped into Klamath Falls, unless some decisive action is taken, according to local operators.
The high freight, express, telegraph, long-distance telephone and light and power rates make it impossible for lumber operators in Lake county to compete on an equal basis with Klamath Falls operators, it was declared.
