

# BOOM TOWN OF TEXAS IN GRIP OF VICE RING

### Officers Are Allied With Bootlegging and Narcotic Elements, Charge

EL PASO, Tex., Aug. 21. (UP.)—Peace officers of the oil boom towns in Winkler county, are members of a vice ring of large proportions, it was charged in a petition filed in federal court here today.

Lovins and Archambault, owners of property in the town of Wink, ask that peace officers and others be restrained from bootlegging and that \$50,000 actual and \$50,000 exemplary damages be assessed against J. M. Schnell, actual lessee.

The petition accuses the officers of open violation of national and state narcotic and prohibition laws. Among the defendants are Sheriff W. A. Priest, Mayor J. L. Ostrom, Justice of the Peace L. C. Hannah, County Attorney Hill D. Hudson, two deputy sheriffs, two constables and a county commissioner.

Mrs. Archambault, according to the petition, appealed to the officials to stop abuse of her property and was arrested and tried for disturbing the peace.

# LINDY'S SPOT ON AIR FIELD WILL BE PARK

ROOSEVELT FIELD, L. I., Aug. 21. (UP.)—The spot here from which Col. Charles A. Lindbergh started his non-stop flight to Paris will be made into a national park known as the Lindbergh Commemorative park. It was announced last night.

A group of prominent men have bought an area of ten acres from Paul J. Lannin, and will establish the park; Lannin is owner of Roosevelt Field.

# WOMEN STRIKE HARD AT SMITH

### Executive Committee of Organization Issues Formal Announcement

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21. (UP.)—The executive committee of the national women's democratic law enforcement league issued a statement last night saying it would be impossible for them to believe any promises regarding prohibition enforcement which Governor Smith may make in his acceptance speech Wednesday.

"While we await with interest Governor Smith's acceptance speech, we know perfectly well that he will pledge 'law enforcement' on his solemn oath," the statement said. "We know he will attempt to fool the millions of dry sober Americans by soft peddling his real and already expressed views on prohibition. Regardless of what he may say, Governor Smith's record speaks for itself.

"All Governor Smith asks is the presidency of the United States, the most honorable and highest position in the world. And all he has to offer is a self-serving promise of an official whose record makes it impossible to believe his promises."

# BIG FREIGHTER MINUS MANY OF CREW IN PORT

BALBOA, C. Z., Aug. 21. (UP.)—Manned by a crew of six deckhands, the mystic line freighter William A. McKeeney limped to Balboa harbor today with its deck rigging gone, its ventilators and rails twisted and its funnels battered, mute evidence of the fury of the storm which swept 14 men overboard on August 9.

The McKeeney encountered the storm 121 miles southeast of Cape St. Lucas. The heavy seas swept over the deck, tearing lifeboats from the davits and sweeping a deckload of lumber overboard.

# ATTORNEY SUES CHINESE TONG

### How Oriental Organization Works to Save Members Revealed

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 21. (UP.)—Efforts of the Bing Kong Tong to save five members who were hanged recently in Arizona for the murder of another Chinese were revealed in a suit filed in superior court here today.

E. A. Eisenhour, Los Angeles attorney, claimed the Tong agreed to pay him \$200 a month to go to Kingman, Ariz., to secure affidavits to show the condemned men were not given a fair trial. The Tong also promised him \$5000 if he secured pardons for the condemned Chinese, he said.

After spending a year securing the affidavits, Eisenhour said he received a telegram ordering him to drop the case.

The suit requested \$2600 salary and the \$5000 bonus.
