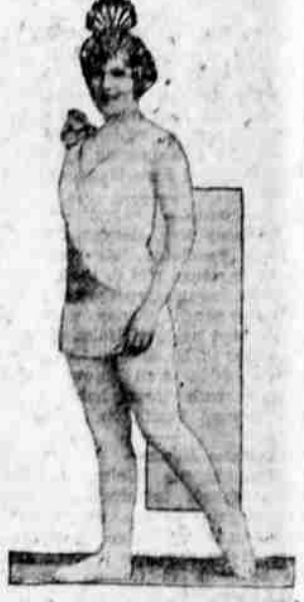

OREGON, IDAHO HIT BY FIRES

Clearwater National Forest Blazes Spread Rapidly Today

LA GRANDE, Ore., Aug. 21. (AP)—A forest fire, started Saturday, was burning today several miles east of La Grande in the vicinity of Five Points near the Tenmly Lumber company property.

Winds yesterday fanned the flames, the fire spreading considerably, but the situation was under this morning. A crew of more than a score men were fighting the fire, and more were being recruited.

Only meager reports were available this morning and whether valuable timber was menaced was not known.

LEWISTON, Ida., Aug. 21. (AP)—New fires over several acres of the Weitas region of the Clearwater National forest makes the situation tense there. Johnson creek is ablaze and is unchecked on the eight-mile front with 7,700 acres of timber destroyed.

Doris creek is also ablaze over 1,200 acres, and spreading, according to the Clearwater sheriff's office.

Scores of men are passing through Orofino each day to the fire line and pack trains are busy hauling food and supplies.

The woods are like tinder and no relief is anticipated until heavy rains come. "The blaze has spread the last few days due to strong winds."
