CALL MEETING TO LOOK INTO NEW TAX PLAN

SALEM, Oct. 13. (UP)—The bank tax problem arising out of the recent federal court decision exempting national banks from the payment of state taxes is to be discussed at two conferences to be held next week.

The first of these conferences will be held at the office of Governor L. Patterson here next Wednesday, and will be attended by members of the state property tax relief commission, the state banking board and representatives of the State Bankers' association.

The second conference will substitute representatives of bond houses, mortgage companies and building and loan associations for the bankers and will be held on the following day. Notices of the conferences have been sent out by John Carlin of Medford, chairman of the tax relief commission, A. A. Smith, of Baker, as chairman of the committee handling this particular phase of the taxation problem, will preside.

Three alternatives by which the bank taxation problem may be met are suggested by Carlin in his notice. The first of these contemplates no attempt at taxation of bank stocks until the federal law can be changed so as to bring national banks under the same law as other banks.

"LOVE SLAYER" CHEATS NOOSE

Youth Dies From Injuries Sustained in Long Fall. KANSAS CITY, Mo., Oct. 13. (UP)—Glenn Jenkins, 29-year-old waiter, whose insane love for Miss Marie Young, 21, led him to stab her in the abdomen with a cheap butcher knife, joined his sweetheart in death last night, succumbing to injuries received in his second effort at suicide.

The "love slayer" who told police he killed his sweetheart "because she asked me to," lived 26 hours after he plunged head first from the second tier of cells at police headquarters. A slightly improved condition earlier today prompted the prosecutor's office to start a thorough investigation of the crime but death intervened.

Jenkins' last words were that he had killed his sweetheart at the bidding of a strange impulse. Marie wanted to die and asked him to kill her.

Although Jenkins was unconscious practically most of the day, hampering the work of investigators, various theories were advanced by officers. "Fear that he might lose the love of Miss Young because his wages of \$20 a month as waiter, or would not finance their marriage, was on the theories. "Girl crazy," was the explanation of others who worked on the assumption the youth had become suddenly insanely jealous.
