BERKELEY, Cal., Nov. 8.—(A.P.)—Forty-two members of the University of California football team, headed by Coach "Nibs" Price, were bound for Seattle, the stronghold of Washington's huskies today, to clash with the Northerners Saturday in a conference encounter.

The bears left here last night and will arrive in Seattle in time for a workout there Friday. All of the bears are in fairly good condition, but it is doubtful if Benny Lom, sensational halfback, will be able to play.

Lom was badly shaken up in the Oregon game last week, and it is likely that Coach Price will keep him out of the Huskie encounter to save him for the big game with Stanford University on November 24.

The great American outdoor fall cabaret is now in full swing and as the average spectator at a football game is as much of an actor in the scenes of color and

enthusiasm as the players themselves, I think it no more than right that the rules committee this winter pass some needed regulations for the well being of the cash customers and newspapermen. Here are a few suggestions I have gathered from alumni, collegians, coaches and scribblers.

1. The starting of the game. The moment the flask is in play the game has officially started and the flask is only considered won when it is empty.

2. Forward passing. In passing the flask to a fellow spectator he does it at his own risk. If it is intercepted, he is thrown for a loss. If it is dropped it is considered down—and out. When running with the flask if he is tackled, the spectator is penalized if he falls on his hip.

3. A spectator is only considered down and out when he is lying flat on his face or back and cannot get up.

4. Running down kicks. One spectator watching another who looks like he might be carrying a flask, must be careful at all times or he may be mistaken for a revenue agent. Here is a chance for the rules committee to pass some regulations that will contribute materially to the happiness and well being of the stands.

It will supplement and strengthen every other program." He said Herbert Hoover "deserves our 100 per cent support. He will get it."

Cherington said friends of prohibition are convinced Hoover will do everything in his power to secure strict prohibition enforcement.

"President-elect Hoover should be assured of the fullest and most active co-operation that can be given to him by the countless millions who believe in, obey and support the constitution," he said.

Wilson declared the defeat of Governor Smith should remove the prohibition issue permanently from partisan politics.

laughing heartily and slapping his thigh on the shoulder. "Your popular vote was greater than Coolidge's," said another of the interviewers.

"Yes, I know it was," said Smith. "That is what I say. The only man who ever got more votes for the presidency than I did was Herbert Hoover."

After fumbling through all his pockets, the governor produced the telegram he received from Hoover thanking Smith for his message of congratulation sent late last night. He exhibited it with apparent pride, although everyone present had seen copies previously distributed.

Returning to his plans, Smith said he had not yet decided whether he would go into business, adding that all he knew was that he would "go to work."

Asked where he would live after quitting the executive mansion in Albany, Smith said that decision would be made by "The boss of the house—Mrs. Smith."

"Move we adjourn," someone suggested and the "Happy Warriors" Swan song was sung.

He grinned bravely as the correspondents filed out. Mrs. Henry Moskowitz, staunch friend of the governor and his publicity manager in the presidential campaign.

BANDIT TAKES OWN LIFE WHEN COPS APPROACH

FLAGSTAFF, ARIZ., Nov. 8.—(U.P.)—A pistol duel between a bandit and two deputy sheriffs ended abruptly here when the former, wounded by one of the officers, shot himself in the head, dying instantly. The bandit has not been identified.

The shooting took place 14 miles east of here on the main highway, when the bandit, cornered by two members of the sheriff's force, opened fire. Deputy Sheriff Vandever brought the man down in the exchange, with a bullet through the lower breast, but before the officers could reach him he had pulled out his gun and ended his life.

KILLED IN EXPLOSION

SAN DIEGO, Cal., Nov. 8.—(A.P.)—Charles Murphy, 35, general manager of the South Coast Gas company and Peter Ralph, 28, employee, were killed when a tank of crude oil exploded in the company's plant at Oceanside, 40 miles north of here. Three other men had a narrow escape.



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
