

TEXANS BLAME J. RASKOB FOR SMITH DEFEAT

Once "Solid South" State, Still Gasping Over Republican Victory

DALLAS, Tex., Nov. 8. (UP)—For the first time in its history Texas will cast its electoral vote for the presidential and vice-presidential candidates of the republican party.

And with this an assumed fact, leaders of all political factions tonight were trying to explain how it came about that Herbert Hoover defeated Alfred E. Smith so overwhelmingly in this normally democratic stronghold.

There was scarcely a doubt left as to the outcome of Tuesday's election. With each additional precinct report Hoover's lead continued to grow. Returns from 247 out of 253 counties, including 71 counties complete, gave Hoover more than a 75,000 majority.

From the little group of men who formed the nucleus of the Anti-Smith group of democrats came the explanation for the defeat. Other leaders held different views but all seemed to agree that poor handling of the democratic campaign by National Democratic chairman, John J. Raskob was the main reason.

Anti-Smith leaders saw in Hoover's election the possibility of a new political party in Texas or at least a reorganization of the present democratic party.

Republican leaders also placed the blame for Smith's defeat at the doorstep of Raskob. "Political blunders," they said, were responsible for this dramatic episode in the political history of the south.

"Raskob lost the state for Al Smith," said Judge H. D. Sartin, manager of the anti-Smith democratic campaign in Texas. "And the victory for Hoover means the dawning of a new day when we can not be imposed on by a man whose ideas and ideas are opposed to ours."

Judge Sartin believes Hoover's election will result in new capital brought into the state, better economic conditions and greater prestige.

W. A. Thomas, campaign manager for the regular democratic group which supported the national ticket, believes the election shows conclusively that no Catholic can ever be chosen to the presidency of the United States.

Governor Dan Moody, democrat, blamed Raskob for Smith's defeat. "Every statement he made lost his candidate votes," he declared.

Anti-Smith Leaders of South Say Principles Overcame All Feeling of Party Allegiance

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 8. (UP)—John H. Johnson, leader of the Anti-Smith campaign, said tonight that the victory of Hoover was the triumph of principle over party feeling.

They were jubilant over the republican victory in which Hoover succeeded for the first time since reconstruction days in breaking into rock-riddled democratic territory by his carrying of North Carolina, Virginia, Florida and Texas.

Bishop James Canon Jr., of Richmond, Va., bishop of Africa of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, in a statement to the United Press declared "Virginia has put principles above party."

HOOPER GIVES MESSAGE TODAY

HOOPER HOME STANFORD UNIVERSITY CAMPUS, Calif., Nov. 8. (AP)—Herbert Hoover in his first message to the American people as President-elect said there had been a vindication in Tuesday's election of "great peace and a determination of the road of progress."

"In this hour there can be for me no feeling of victory or exultation," he said. "Rather it imposes a sense of solemn responsibility of the future."

The message of the President-elect in full follows:

"I can make no adequate expression of gratitude for the overwhelming confidence of our people who without regard to section or interest have selected me for President of the whole United States."

"There has been a vindication of great issues and a determination of the true road of progress. The republican party has again been assessed with a great responsibility."

"In this hour there can be for me no feeling of victory or exultation, rather it imposes a sense of solemn responsibility of the future and of complete dependence upon divine guidance for the task which the greatest office in the world imposes. That task is to give the best within me to interpret the common sense and the ideals of the American people."

"I can only succeed in my part by the co-operation and unity of spirit of all leaders of opinion and of action for the common service of our country."
