

STEWART FOUND NOT GUILTY BY JURY TUESDAY

Oil Magnate Wins Freedom of Charges of Perjury

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—(U.P.)—Robert W. Stewart, oil magnate and recipient of one-fourth of the \$2,000,000 Liberty bond fund of the noted continental trading company, was acquitted yesterday by a district of Columbia jury on all three counts of an indictment charging perjury before the Senate Teapot Dome committee.

Woman Admits Slaying Aged Woman Sunday

WICKLIFFE, Ky., Nov. 21. (AP)—Mrs. Lizzie Boudreaux, 49, in jail here today on a charge of murder, has admitted to authorities that she was responsible for the death Sunday of Mrs. Anne Thornton, 65, whose body was found severely mutilated with an ax, and says she would do it again, but refuses to assign a motive for the crime.

The body of the aged woman was found about 3 o'clock in the afternoon by Henry Leach, her son, and less than half an hour later Mrs. Boudreaux was arrested while attempting to board a boat for Cairo, Ill.

Mrs. Boudreaux lived in Paducah until about two months ago, where she operated a lodging house. Leach boarded at her place while engaged in construction work near Paducah, and shortly after his departure from Ohio, Mrs. Boudreaux is said to have followed.

Mrs. Boudreaux had been residing at the home of Mrs. Thornton for the last two weeks. A divorce bill alleging misconduct on his wife's part was filed by Boudreaux about two weeks ago.

G. O. P. EXPENSE ACCOUNT GIVEN

Sum Of \$24,239.17 Expended On Behalf Of Republican Candidates

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 21. (AP)—Willis K. Clark, treasurer of the state central committee, reports to the secretary of state that he expended \$24,239.17 in behalf of party candidates in the recent campaign. John L. Day, chairman of the Multnomah county central committee, reports an expenditure of \$4802.

L. B. Smith, secretary of the Greater Oregon association, which was interested mainly in the defeat of the income tax measure, reports an expenditure of \$6,281.14 by that organization. A. Wm. Henning, treasurer of the Oregon Industrial council, shows an expenditure by that council of \$2034.41.

John L. Day, as chairman of the republican congressional committee for the third district, reports an expenditure of \$1114.92 in behalf of Franklin F. Korell, successful republican candidate for congress. W. C. Culbertson, who was Korell's democratic opponent, shows that he spent \$127.95.

John Andrew Smith, treasurer of the Smith-for-President league reports an expense of \$643.01.

BLONDE MODEL IS QUESTIONED

Police Suspect Young New York Woman of Knowing Slayer

CHICAGO, Nov. 21. (UP)—Mrs. Ruth Keyes, 24, blonde model, was taken into custody for questioning today in the murder of Arnold Rothstein, New York gambler.

She admitted she was living at the Park Central hotel in New York city on the night Rothstein was killed but denied that she knew him or George McManus who is sought in connection with the murder.

She admitted having drinks with a man whom she flirited with and knew him only as "Jack" in room 249 of the hotel but said she knew nothing of the shooting or whether that room was the scene of the murder. She denied that she called Lindy's restaurant and asked for Rothstein at about the time the shooting occurred.

NORFOLK, Va., Nov. 21. (U.P.)—Miss Maude Nesselrodt, who disappeared from the St. Lawrence University at Canton, N. Y., last July, is at the home of her uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. L. F. Nesselrodt, near Williamsburg, Va., it was learned last night.

Her uncle, it was stated, had spent large sums of money employing private detectives to find her and had offered a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to her whereabouts. The girl said she ran away from college because she wanted to see the world.

"I visited Toronto, Buffalo, Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland and many other places," she said. "I did not try to hide from detectives. I worked in stores with other girls and when I grew tired of one place I would go to another. I had many experiences which I may reveal in a book I contemplate writing."
