OREGON STATE ACCORDED HUGE HOME WELCOME

Portland, Corvallis Give Grid Heroes Appropriate Homecoming

CORVALLIS, Ore., Dec. 7. (AP)—Ending a day of unprecedented welcome to an athletic team, Oregon State college grid heroes returned to the campus amidst wild acclaim from the largest rally ever staged by students and townspeople.

A battery of railroad torpedoes exploding as the special train entered city limits was the signal for a bedlam of whistles, bells and cheers as the cars rolled to stop in a mass of weling students.

Some organized cheers for team were sent up as the men were hurried into automobiles for a final parade to the campus behind the 75 piece cadet band which met them in Portland.

A brief victory dance in Memorial Union building became more like general visit until the party broke up promptly at midnight.

The team's final drive for "parade" began this morning as classwork resumed, and was interrupted only when time-out was called by the administration at 11 o'clock for special convocation when an official tribute was paid by officials of the campus and city.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 7. (AP)—Portland's welcome to the victorious Oregon State College football team reached its climax in a banquet before the departure of the players for Corvallis where the final rousing greeting awaited them.

Met at the train by a cheering crowd and playing bands, the players were taken on a parade through the city, and then were guests of honor at the banquet.

WOLF HUNTING BY PLANE WILL BE NEW SPORT

MINNEAPOLIS, Dec. 7. (AP)—An expedition to hunt wolves by airplane was being outfitted today by Edwin D. Fox and L. M. Chandler.

Chandler, who is president of the Minnesota Aircraft association, will do the shooting while Fox will handle the controls. They plan to operate through northern Minnesota from a base at Cass Lake, flying about until they spot the wolves and then swooping low and killing them.

The state pays a bounty of \$15 for each wolf. If the expedition proves a financial success, other trips are planned.

KLAMATH RIVER DAM PLANS ARE SEVERELY HIT

SACRAMENTO, Dec. 7. (AP)—The United States government will not permit the construction of dams on the Klamath river as long as there is a state initiative in effect which prohibits such construction, it was announced today in a letter received at the state department of natural resources from the United States department of the interior.

The decision was the culmination of a controversy of several months' standing between California sportsmen, represented by the state fish and game commission, and alleged "interests."

The federal government was approached following report that an attempt might be made to construct dams for power purposes on the Hoopa Indian reservation, where the state has no jurisdiction.

The grand jury will reconvene December 19.
