

WINK, TEX., IS CHANGED TO 9 O'CLOCK BURG

Bright Lights "Winked" Out As Federal Agents Stage Clean-Up

WINK, Tex., Dec. 21. (UP)—Bright lights of this 22 boom town have gradually winked out as federal agents and Texas rangers progress with their vice cleanup, started after a spectacular hijacking and kidnaping fracas. Tonight the town might well be dubbed a "nine o'clock here" as most of the gambling houses and saloons have been closed.

Officers are patrolling the streets where last Monday the people gathered to discuss the disappearance of P. C. "Denver Blackie" Burham and to help Sheriff "Pecos Hill" Priest institute one of the greatest posse hunts ever staged in this section. Those who discuss the case now are agreed that hijacking and run running do not mix; that retaliation in the form of kidnaping and stranding a man on the sand hills of a Texas desert may cause a very bad taste in the mouth.

The few agents remaining in Winkler county are continuing their search for evidence of violations which they claim concern practically every vice act in the statutes.

Of the scores arrested in the Tuesday raid, 27 are held on federal warrants. Five of this number are women. They were given hearings before United States Commissioner W. W. Dean and released on bond.

The principals in the case were not so fortunate. Judge Less C. "Hard Boiled" Hannah refused to release "Denver Blackie" and his partner, B. W. Craig and the two men, "Red" Heaton and L. M. Hickle on bond. They are resting in jails in different parts of the county and may stay there until March when their trials would likely be set, charges against them are sufficient to send them to the electric chair if they are convicted under Texas laws.

Burham and his pal are held on suspicion of holding up a liquor caravan with deadly weapons.

Heaton and Hickle are charged with assault with intent to murder and leaving Burham on the desert to perish.

THEATERS ARE DEFENDANT IN LARGE LAWSUIT

SEATTLE, Wash., Dec. 21. (UP)—A suit threatening to involve the entire West Coast Theaters circuit in a heated legal battle was filed here late last night by the Pioneer Securities company asking that a receiver be appointed for the Liberty Theater company and damages totaling \$29,202.

The suit alleged failure to pay rent since July 1 and failure to pay for the removal of furniture in the theater.

WOULD MARRY BOY SERVING SENTENCE

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 21.—Mamie Roler, 18, who came here from Commerce, Okla., will marry Frank Taylor, two years her senior, today was seeking federal permission to marry the youth, who is serving a six months' sentence for violation of the Mann Act.

Shakespeare's Shade Appears In Law Action

NEW YORK, Dec. 21. (UP)—Shakespeare's shade was brought into a courtroom today to confront Anne Nichols, suing a movie company for plagiarism of her "Able's Irish Rose," and was sent slinking away by Miss Nichols, who indicated with some emphasis that she found the Bard's "Merchant of Venice" rather boring.

Miss Nichols accuses the Universal pictures company of swiping her play for its "The Cohens and the Kellys". She asks an accounting of profits so she can collect royalties that would total about \$3,000,000.

The company denied seeking inspiration from Miss Nichols' classic, and annoyed her somewhat by suggesting that the plot—that of religious tolerance, the romance of a Jew and a Christian—was old.

It was insinuated, that Miss Nichols herself might have been helped a little by reading the Merchant of Venice, and its romance between Jessica and Lorenzo.

LIFE SENTENCE GIVEN BOY WHO SLEW TEACHER

STANTON, Mich., Dec. 21. (UP)—Jimmy Deacons, 15, who confessed that he murdered Flossie Carter, his former school teacher, because she slapped him for throwing paper wads three years ago, was sentenced to life imprisonment by Judge R. S. Hawley today. Before the sentence, witnesses told of Deacons' confession and investigation of the crime.

TWO CONVICTS AGAIN IN PEN

TACOMA, Wash., Dec. 21. (AP)—The two convicts who staged a cleverly planned escape from the United States penitentiary at McNeil Island during early morning devotional service yesterday, were captured on the south point of Eagle Island, near here, this morning.

The two men, Jesse R. Watkins, 25, serving a life sentence for murder committed in San Francisco in 1927 and Alvin Hodges, 29, of Phoenix, Ariz., serving a year's sentence for automobile theft, were found concealed in a clump of dense undergrowth by two penitentiary guards.

STATE OFFICER GETS JOB BACK

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 21. (AP)—(Pete) Reinhart, who several months ago retired as an officer of the state traffic department because of an alleged infraction of the state game law, has been reinstated, according to an authoritative announcement.
