

WANTS TO FACE TRIAL IN COURT

ATLANTA, Ga., Jan. 15, (U.P.)—A young Neo-Pagan, an ultra-modern son of wealth whose love for excitement and pleasure drove him to robbery and to murder, goes to trial today.

George Harsh, the aforementioned Neo-Pagan, crack pistol shot, lover on Moody Russian literature, the reckless and handsome collegian, welcomes the moment when he will enter the courtroom.

The "thrill slayer," held in Fulton Tower with his alleged companion in crime, Richard Gallooly, is bored with three months of tedious waiting and, according to his jailer, is looking forward with pleasure to the hour of 2:30 o'clock today when he will take his seat in the Fulton superior courtroom.

Harsh and Gallooly were indicted for the murder of two men, young clerks who were killed last October in defending the cash registers of their employers. Gallooly will go on trial January 29, it was announced yesterday.

Harsh has confessed, according to police, to the murder of S. H. Meeks, killed in the robbery of a grocery store on the night of October 6, and to the slaying of Willard Smith, who was slain in a drug store robbery 10 days later.

SHOOTING, SLUGGING "TOUGH GUY" ENDS UP BEHIND BARS OF JAIL

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 14, (U.P.)—When Leo R. Helling, former Salt Lake automobile salesman, aliened two women fighting over his affections by shooting at one and knocking the other out with a punch in the jaw, he paved the way to jail for himself and two companions.

Suspicion of robbery and violations of the Dyer and Mann acts, which refer to interstate transportation of stolen autos and of women for immoral purposes, respectively, were charged today against Helling and Mrs. Gloria Crowl, 29. Helling's brother, William, 17, was held as a delinquent under the Dyer act.

The cause of the argument was 17-year-old Cleo Chumway, who told police she was brought here by the others from Salt Lake in a car stolen there January 2. After arriving here January 5, the machine was sold last Wednesday to a dealer for \$15, she said.
