

Gorman Refuses to Fight

LARRY HOLMAN IS SIGNED FOR LEGION MATCH

Hood River Scrapper Runs Out of Fight, According to Wire

Nails Gorman, Hood River heavyweight, has refused to fight the main event of the Legion fight card tonight. He wired the boxing commission to that effect today.

Larry Holman, Bend heavyweight, has been signed in his place to meet Orville Darr, sensational light heavyweight tonight.

Members of the commission said today that they would not only bar Gorman from ever fighting in Klamath Falls again, but would also send resolutions to the state boxing commissions of Oregon and California advising those bodies of Gorman's actions and suggesting that they also bar Gorman from fighting in either state.

It developed that Gorman, while training for his Darr fight, suddenly accepted an invitation to meet "Dusty" Miller, British Columbia heavyweight, in Vallejo, Calif., last night.

Gorman was knocked cold in the seventh round by Miller and wired this morning that he was "badly cut up; can't go on."

"He's through," one member of the commission said today. "We'll do everything in our power to make him pay dearly for this."

The fight card will go on as scheduled, however, but Larry Holman will fight instead of Gorman.

The Bend heavyweight will outweight Darr by a good many pounds and will give the Spokane sensation a good fight.

Other fights on the card include:

Mike Daley, Pelican City, vs. Jimmy Murray, Bend, semi-wind-up. Jack Breedlove vs. Chuck Martin, six rounds. Billie Breedlove vs. Bur Jerry, and Roy Rose vs. Ed Egan.

"The card will be just as good without Gorman," said Tex Blackstaff, fight promoter. "It's too bad, though, because some of the fans will get the wrong idea of the fight."

Cyril Walker's disqualification in the Los Angeles open reminds me of a similar penalty Bill Klem inflicted in a ball game once.

MacDonald Smith, who won the event, is just the opposite. He is a very brisk player. The officials went to Walker and suggested that he let Smith play through him. Walker refused, however, so they disqualified him.

It looks a little unfair, but it was little different from the stunt of Klem's. One cold day when he was going in as a relief pitcher, Hub Purdee of Boston was warming up out in the bull pen. Klem motioned for him to come in, but Hub pretended he didn't see him and kept warming up.

So Klem called, "Ball one!" Still Purdee wouldn't come in. "Ball two" was called. Hub came to terms then. "You can't do that," he roared at Klem. "I did do it, didn't I?" said Klem.

"That's the kind of breaks I get," complained Hub. "Before I step into the box there's two balls on the hitter."

Two Managers Squabble Over Fight Referee

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 15. (AP)—Promoter Jack Dempsey today was prepared to use the big stick, if necessary, to maintain peace and quiet between "Pa" Stripling and Johnny Buckler, managers of the principals in his February 27 battle at Flamingo Park, when they met to spar over the selection of a referee.

He expected to take no part in the actual selection, he said, as long as the managers seemed to agree, but he warned Stripling and Buckler that any unnecessary loud talking would end negotiations. In that event, Dempsey will name the third man in the ring tomorrow.

While Sharkey hammered the heavy bags and went through three rounds with sparring partners, Young Stripling left with his brother "Baby" for Melbourne, Fla., where he will second the youngster in a fight tonight. The Georgia battler will return here late today.

Favor Lomski Over Griffith In Big Fight

DETROIT, Feb. 15. (AP)—Gerard Ambrose Griffith, the tough one from Sioux City, Ia., meets the test of his career tonight when he engages Leo Lomski, recognized as the leading challenger for the world's light heavyweight championship, in a 10-round contest.

The bout will be to a referee's decision at the light heavyweight, 175 pounds. Indications today were that the battle would be witnessed by a crowd of 12,000 to 15,000 with receipts at \$40,000 to \$50,000.

The winner will be admittedly the leading challenger to the light heavyweight championship held by Tommy Loughran. Lomski is figured to have an advantage over the Iowa youngster due to his greater experience in major encounters, his superior boxing skill and the physical edge of having been through a tough bout with James J. Braddock, who recently scored a knockout triumph over Griffith.

Griffith, however, has ruggedness, speed and dangerous punching ability.

Lomski figures to weigh around 171 pounds at scale time this afternoon with Griffith scaling about 174.
