## DISCUSS PLANS FOR NEXT CARD

### Fans Show Support of Legion Fights at Memorial Building.

Present plans mature. Klamath Falls next fight card will be staged in two weeks at the Legion Memorial hall.

That the insanity of Wilkins continues as to any matter involving the person of Brooks, but as to all other matters he is now mentally responsible.

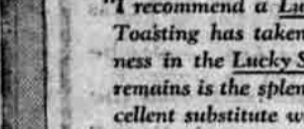
