

# Fighters In Pink Of Condition For 28 Rounds Of Boxing At Legion Hall

## BOYD CERTAIN HE'LL DEFEAT ORVILLE DARR

### Hard Hitting "Spark Plug" Ready for Fray This Evening.

Behind a question of doubt, it looks like one of the best fight cards seen in Klamath in many months, will be staged tonight in the Legion Memorial hall when 28 rounds of fighting in five good bouts, are scheduled.

Orville Darr meets one of the toughest heavyweights on the coast in the person of "Spark Plug" Boyd, hardly longer from Aberdeen who has been fighting main events for seven years.

Boyd is in great condition for his bout tonight and is not underestimating his opponent.

"Yeah," he said, "I've heard of this guy Darr before and I'd like to get a crack at him. Understand he's a good boy."

"Uh-huh; I'm in great shape and believe me, I'll be in there tonight to try and stow away this Spokane lad before the fifth round; what's more I think I can do it."

Darr is quietly confident. He has worked like a Trojan for this bout because he realizes that it is a great chance to soar to pugilistic heights in the northwest. This 23-year-old fighter is an-

**A MAIN EVENT**

"Spark Plug" Boyd hails from Aberdeen, and is one of the best known heavyweights on the coast. He has been in the game for seven years and has met practically every heavyweight and light heavyweight of note in the northwest during that time. He has fought such boys as Young Firpe—whom he got a draw—Pete Cerkan, Jimmy Darcy etc.

Orville Darr, aged 23, has had 49 fights, has 14 kayos to his credit, hails from Spokane, and weighs 180 pounds. He has only one kayo against him, and that one a technical knockout at the hands of Dusty Miller of Vancouver in the ninth round. He drew with Gene O'Grady and slowed away Harry Holman in 2 rounds.

**SEMI-WINDUP**

A Bob James hails from Seattle and comes to Klamath Falls as a good tough boy. He is an accredited semi-windup fighter. He is a middleweight.

Jack Breedlove weighs 150 pounds and in his last start defeated Chuck Martin. He is a willing fighter and regarded as a comer.

**SPECIAL EVENT**

"Steamboat" Jackson, weighs 150 pounds, comes from Spokane and has been in the game for several years. In his work-outs he has shown a clever left and right and an ability to take punishment. He is a middleweight. He has had 24 fights, defeated "Buzz Saw" Barnell once and drew once. He drew Allie Misham and beat Johnnie Walker.

Wilbur Harrington, Chiloquin Indian, who takes the place of Ray Huffman, in the special event, is one of the hardest hitting fighters ever developed in the Klamath country. He is a popular fighter.

Joe Sleafoff has boxed Mandell, Joe Jackson, Clonie Tate, Don Frazier and most of the other good welter and lightweights in the east. He fought 22 main events in Milwaukee and recently secured a draw with Ray McQuillan, sensational negro fighter. He met and drew with Kewpie Riley and also fought Don Mack. He hails from Seattle.

Eddie Morris, also has a good record having fought young Jack Thompson, sensational negro welter, and others of equal prominence. Morris is from San Francisco.

Stego said, "He no doubt planned it. If we had all the men we're after, we still would hold him."

The killers who Stego said were paid \$10,000 each to aid in wiping out the George Moran gang were Fred Burke and James Ray, former member of the St. Louis "Egan's Raps".

Assistant State's Attorney David Stansbury said he had learned that Burke and Ray achieved their reputation as slayers when they killed Frank Yale in New York last July 1.

Yale and "Scarface Al" Capone, Chicago gang chief, worked together for a while. Stansbury related, exchanging hired killers who were not known to their victims, but they had a falling out. Capone was in Miami, Fla., the day Yale was shot, Stansbury pointed out. Just as he was last Valentine's day. New York police traced the guns used by Yale killers to Miami.

The Capone gang had a hand in the Valentine's day massacre as well as the Yale killing. Stansbury said, and when gang leaders decided to wipe out the Moran gang, it was natural that they should turn to the killers who had done "the New York job" so efficiently and who were not known here.
