RAIL PROJECT GETS SUPPORT

Unqualified approval of the extension of the Great Northern railroad from Klamath Falls 50 miles south to Lookout, California, and of the Western Pacific 120 miles north to connect with the G. N. at Lookout, is expressed by the Lookout arange, number 415, in a resolution recently adopted.

The resolution reads as follows: Whereas, The Great Northern R. R. has asked the Interstate Commission permission to construct a railroad from Klamath Falls, Oregon to Lookout, California, and

Whereas, The Western Pacific R. R. has asked the Interstate Commission permission to construct a railroad from Paxton to Lookout, and

Whereas, The section that the proposed passes through is not now served by any railroad, and

Whereas, The section traversed by the proposed railroad is rich in natural undeveloped resources, and

Whereas, The construction of this proposed railroad would open a market for these resources and encourage the development of industries—

There be it resolved, That the Lookout Grange No. 415, unanimously endorse the movement and urge that the Interstate Commerce Commission grant the franchise, asked for in the petition.

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this Grange and a copy be sent to The Interstate Commerce Commission, The Great Northern R. R. and the Western Pacific Railroad Co's.

EXECUTIVES OF CHAMBERS WILL MEET ON 19TH

Earl C. Reynolds, Klamath Secretary, Will Take Part at Session

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, March 6. (Special)—Klamath Falls and Klamath county will have a prominent place in the discussions at the annual short course for chamber of commerce secretaries to be held on the University of Oregon campus March 19 to 23.

Earl C. Reynolds, secretary of the Klamath county chamber of commerce, will lead a community clinic at which various problems facing the Klamath district will be thoroughly discussed, and solutions for similar problems found elsewhere will be brought out.

Southern Oregon in general stands out on the conference program. Ted Baker, of Medford, is president of the state association of chamber secretaries, and will preside at the sessions. J. H. Harvey, secretary of the Grants Pass chamber, will discuss land settlement in Josephine county, while George Moser, Ashland chamber secretary, will lecture on various community problems.

Began several years ago, the short course sponsored by the school of business administration have developed rapidly in interest and attendance, and are believed to answer a need for a common meeting place for community and civic workers of the state. Dean David E. Faville is in charge of this year's conference, which is of particular interest because the commonwealth conference will be revived on the Eugene campus at the same time and much of interest to visiting secretaries will be taken up in these sessions.

As in the past, secretaries present for the first time will wear green caps of university freshmen, while those who have attended for several years will have graduation exercises, when they will parade in caps and gowns and receive "diplomas." University students will be home on vacation at the time, abandoning the campus to the secretaries.

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REPORT SHOWS TAX SITUATION

districts where the total school tax—bond redemption included—is placed this year at \$254,790.31, or an increase over last year of \$48,474.27.

Valuation of Klamath municipalities materially increased as also did total taxes. Mr. Terrill's figures show that the total tax of Klamath Falls, Chiloquin, Bonanza, Merrill and Malin this year is \$629,500.06 or \$115,342.56 greater than last year.

Total valuation of Klamath Falls is \$9,346,373.34. Total levy is 63.4 mills and the total tax \$592,566.07.

Mr. Terrill's summary of county, state and special taxes reveals that there is an increase of \$28,929.69 in the state tax, an increase of \$37,011.63 in the county tax, an increase of \$71,457.37 in the special school, city and road tax, and a gain of \$5,347.43 in the fire patrol irrigation and drainage tax.

The review shows that there were 1,353,297 acres of land taxed whose total valuation was placed at \$16,689,125. Valuation on logging roads was placed at \$263,200; on steamboats, sailboats and manufacturing machinery, \$762,590.

There are 1764 horses and mules in Klamath and 15,795 head of cattle. Number of sheep total 63,507; of swine, 909; of dogs, 156; and of foxes, 87.

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
