

**M. E. Minister
Is Arraigned;
Libel Charged**

LOS ANGELES, March 21.—Rev. H. P. Shuler, the crusading pastor of Trinity Methodist church, was arraigned on his third libel accusation and announced that he would make his trial a trial of the "Bungling" administration of Mayor George E. Cryer, who brought the action.

Rev. Shuler was ordered to return next Tuesday to plead to accusations that he maliciously questioned the honesty and integrity of the mayor. The libel counts are based on articles in the Pastor's magazine in which he assertedly intimated that Cryer mysteriously had acquired great wealth.

"Mayor Cryer has invited a trial of his term of office and I accept," Rev. Shuler said.
