The public is invited to attend the Good Friday services at the Pine Tree on Friday from noon until one o'clock.

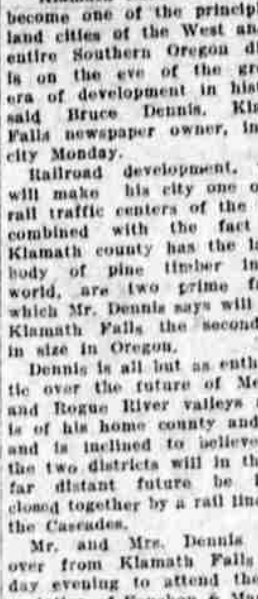

commander-in-chief of the revolutionists, has had opportunity to observe the efficacy of an air force. Federal bombers dropped their deathdealing missiles on Torroon while the rebel general, was in command there, resulting in several casualties, and yesterday a federal bomber attacked Jimenez, the rebel base, and killed four persons and injured 17.

The rebels have two bombing planes immediately available. It was reported here, and they are understood to own several planes suitable for conversion into either fighting or bombing planes.
