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Police Issue Hundreds of Dog Licenses

Enforcement of the law calling for the licensing of every dog, is meeting with splendid results, according to Keith Ambrose, chief of police. "Since March first, this office has issued 517 licenses, bringing a total of \$782", Chief Ambrose stated today. Dogs not having licenses will be picked up and carried to the local pound. A check of dogs disposed of during the past two years, showed a total of 400. "The days when the canine of the city can romp about on flower beds and gardens in a spirit of unmolested abandon are nearing an end. Dogs without licenses found molesting property will be disposed of immediately," Chief Ambrose concluded.
