Hammers Out Home Run in Opening Game of Season.

Whatever the fate of the Yankees in their fourth quest for the rainbow, and its pot of pennant gold, American league pitchers are due to spend many anxious moments trying to circumvent a Babe Ruth bent upon battering down the fences in left field instead of right. Employing an entirely new stance at the plate, with his left foot swung back almost out of the batter's box, the big bandle opened his 1929 campaign with a home run in his first attempt yesterday, and so started the Yankees toward a 7 to 3 triumph over the Red Sox in the first game at the Yankee stadium.

The cold weather kept the opening day crowd down to 25,000 hardy clients, but a good half of these mobbed the home run king in a friendly but vigorous fashion at the close.

The Athletics made it two straight over the Senators at Washington, winning by 8 to 2. Babe Waberg, out for his first career, never was in danger after the Mackinn got him six runs in the fifth.

The Browns won their third straight from the White Sox by 4 to 1, and the Cleveland Indians made it two out of three from Detroit with an 8 to 4 victory.

The eastern opening of the National league was just as frost-bitten as that of the American, and more dismal. The Giants gave an unkempt display in themselves. They fight a six-round special event.

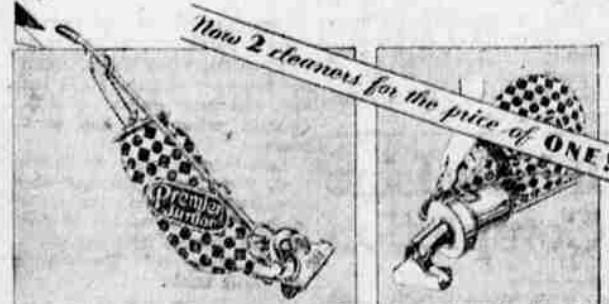
In a special match between the mail carriers and the telephone company the "Hell" boys won two games out of three, but the mail boys won total pins by a margin of 24 pins.
