

WEST KLAMATH SITE TO OPEN

erty of C. L. Holliday. One hundred and sixty acres have been converted from pasture land to a modern town. There are 400 more acres available for the same purpose. Six miles of streets have been graded, a pressure water system has been installed and the community is served by electric lights, power and telephone.

The community is located four miles west of Klamath Falls. The road turns into the new town at the Junction Service Station.

Part of the new town lies on a slope overlooking the mill and the Klamath basin stretching out to the south; the rest is on the flat portion of the field, next to the mill site. It is said to be the biggest town site development ever undertaken in Klamath and represents the labor of one year of construction and negotiation.

Approximately \$100,000 has been expended already on property and development and extensive future investments are in prospect. Mr. Holliday has had erected ten modern homes and will construct more in the future. The venture was financed through the Western Savings and Loan company, the same concern which has financed other big building projects in Klamath Falls.

Mr. Knowles said that it is planned to construct and sell 100 houses in the immediate future.

"We expect to have a city of 5000 people within the next five years," Mr. Knowles said. "We will incorporate as soon as the required number of people are established residents, in order that the community may issue bonds for municipal improvements. The community is served with telephone, light, power, an arterial highway and the Great Northern railroad."

The California Oregon Power company has taken over the water system which was constructed by the developers of the townsite last year.

Bob Gordon of Fort Klamath is in the city today on business. He is a brother of Miss Faye Gordon entered in the beauty contest.

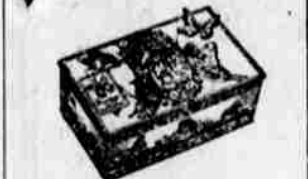
