

SCANDAL BLOWS INTO HOMES AT DIVORCE TRIAL

Many Prominent People Dragged Into Sudden Publicity

SAN FRANCISCO, April 26. (AP)—The breath of scandal blew over a score of innocent looking affidavits today and sent shivers into a dozen homes as a superior judge considered the divorce action of Helbush versus Helbush.

The divorce proceedings of Herman Helbush, Los Angeles and San Francisco capitalist, and Mrs. Gwyneth Helbush, was a drab affair until late yesterday, when a score of prominent persons, ranging from motion picture directors and stars down to capitalists and negro chauffeurs were dragged into sudden publicity as Helbush filed a series of affidavits charging his wife with indiscretions from Waikiki to Los Angeles and from Hollywood to San Francisco.

Mrs. Helbush countered with another series of documents, in which she entered denials to certain of the charges and alleged that some of her husband's asserted evidence had been framed. She asserted her husband had purchased evidence against her at a high price.

Among prominent persons mentioned as attending various parties at which the alleged indiscretions occurred were Kenneth Harlan, motion picture actor, Edna Purviance, screen actress; Leroy Nickel, Miller and Lux heir; Evan S. Pillsbury, San Francisco society man; Allen G. Murphy, Los Angeles rubber magnate, and a long line of citizens of prominence as well as chauffeurs and maids.

The first affidavit filed in behalf of Helbush was by Jack C. Sullivan, a motion picture director, who recited numerous alleged instances to intimate relations between himself and Mrs. Helbush. These were denied by the wife, who said Sullivan's signature to the document was purchased by Helbush "at a high price".

REBEL FORCES FALL BACK AS ARMY ATTACKS

MEXICO CITY, April 25. (U P)—Rebel forces evacuated Navajon, Sonora, late today under heavy machine gun fire from federal airplanes. Gen. Lazaro Cardenas messaged the president tonight. Federal troops have not yet entered the city, he said.

This evacuation followed shortly after the rebel retreat from Masisea, Sonora. According to General Cardenas, the rebels are fleeing to the north and will be in no position to offer battle south of Hermosillo, Sonora.

MR. M'COLLUM ACQUIRES YARD ON 6TH STREET

Improvements Will Be Established; W. T. Dean in Charge

The sixth Street Lumber company has sold its retail lumber yard to George McCollum, prominent business man and sawmill operator. It was announced last night.

The owners of the company, R. P. Ellingson and E. O. Ellingson, retained the manufacturing plant and will continue in that phase of the business.

Mr. McCollum acquired two dry sheds, five acres of land and approximately \$10,000 worth of lumber in the yard. He revealed plans to combine the dry sheds, to construct a planer shed 60 by 70 feet with sawing equipment, and to erect a new store and office building.

W. T. Dean, an experienced lumber dealer, will be in charge of the operation.

Mr. McCollum plans to haul lumber from his mill on the Klamath river, 18 miles west of Klamath Falls, to the retail yard, where it will be finished and put in stock. All form of retail stock will be kept on hand.

Thrills, laughs, spectacle, drama—these are the things that go to make "Slide, Kelly, Slide" one of the outstanding pictures of the year.

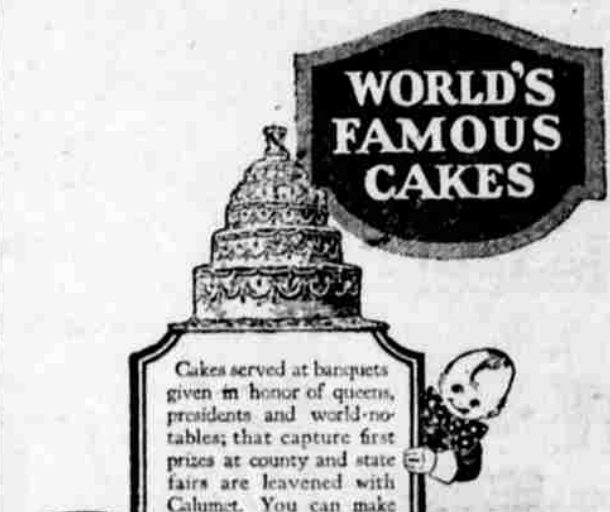
