FORBES SHOWS CLASS DURING HIS TRAINING

Boxes Four Hard Rounds With Mike Daley at Pelican City

Bill, punch and speed of Frankie Forbes, Hollywood fighter, was displayed last night in a hard four-round workout against Mike Daley, Pelican City.

Forbes was to complete tonight at all times and more than lived up to his reputation. His straight hard punches, with short, hard left and right hooks looked good in any league.

Forbes meets the veteran "Cher" Johnny Cline Friday night in Legion Memorial hall in what should be the best fight ever seen in Klamath Falls, extending even the two cards on which Cline and Walter Cleghorn fought main events.

The 23-year-old California pugilist possesses the perfect fighting build. He has wide, muscular shoulders with the even growth sweeps of a fighter. He leans to slender hips and legs. The muscles of his back and of his forearms attest to the punch he carries in each hand. Cline will be one of the toughest fighters he has ever met and Forbes is quite aware he faces a real fight.

"They say," the young man said, "that Cline has never been knocked out. Well, that will be my objective this fight. If I can see him out just right, he'll be down. I know that, and I don't care how tough they are. If you connect right, it's curtains. But he's a tough boy, all right; anybody who has the record he boasts of is a real fighter and no mistake. I've never seen him in the ring but have heard plenty. As to giving away a few pounds, that doesn't bother me in the least. I'd give away more, if necessary."

Forbes will work out tonight at 8:15 at the Legion gym.
