

New Passenger Schedule of Great Northern Announced; Schedule Five Hours Shorter

A new passenger service between Chicago and the Pacific Northwest, consisting of a fleet of new trains running on a five-hour faster schedule than present transcontinental trains, will be inaugurated by the Great Northern railway June 10, according to advice received yesterday by C. N. Christensen, general agent, from W. P. Kenney, vice-president and director of traffic.

The new train, which it is said will constitute the last word in transcontinental passenger service, will be named "The Empire Builder" in honor of James J. Hill, whose pioneering efforts in the development of the Northwest gave him that title.

Mr. Kenney said that except for the building of the 8-mile tunnel under the Cascades, the Great Northern has never done a thing was worthy of giving recognition to its distinguished founder.
