Too Much Pity for Criminal and Not Enough for Society Claims Chicago Prosecutor

CHICAGO, April 29 (UPI)—

Sympathy for a rap is opportune only when he is in a trap where he will behave and likewise we should feel sorry for criminals only when they are confined in jail cells, State's Attorney John A. Swanson told a gathering of ministers here today.

The prosecutor's speech was made in answer to the critics of his five-months' administration of the office he took over on promise to "wipe out hoodlums, racketeering and crime in Chicago," too much sympathy for criminals encourages crime, he said.

"Youth," he declared, "is the outstanding contributor to our last 10 years of increasing delinquency and law defiance. Every man and woman in the country, particularly if they are parents, should ponder that well."

"It is a direct challenge to the American home and to the forces of law and order, for these

children are suffering from the lack of a lesson they were never taught at home—respect for authority. Probably 80 per cent of offenders and felons today are under 25 years of age."

Swanson said that too many persons are getting soft-hearted and that their philosophical ideas are encouraging rather than deterring crime. He disagreed with scientists who claim that the criminal is "not bad but sick."

"We as a people are getting soft," he said. "Softness and philosophical, sentimental nonsense often are behind not only law breaking but public condoning of crime after they have been committed."

"Concern for the criminal rather than concern for the law has been defined, clamor for saving him rather than the law; emphasis upon the tragedy of his fate instead of his victim's are common examples of this soft thinking."

"Let us be sorry for criminals, yes. But as we feel sorry for a mad dog, we don't arbitrate with him. We can be sorry for a rat but the trap is the only place he will behave."

Swanson announced that establishment three weeks ago of a felony court had eliminated long delays in trying such cases and predicted that the system would prove effective in his war against crime.
