AIMEE'S CASE WILL NOT BE INVESTIGATED

District Attorney Said He Is "Sick and Disgusted With Its Recurrence"

LOS ANGELES, May 3. (AP)—District Attorney Buran W. Fitts announced that he would not reopen the famous Aimee Semple McPherson case on the basis of evidence brought out during the impeachment trial of Superior Judge Carlos S. Hardy.

"If the public feels as I do about this case they are sick and disgusted with it, and with its constant recurrence," he said.

"I emphatically do not intend to reopen this case, dismissed some two and a half years ago, unless additional evidence of a competent nature is presented to this office."

"The action of the state senate showed clearly its disbelief in evidence upon which this office would have to rely in court."

Fitts said the original prosecution of the evangelist cost thousands of dollars, adding that it would cost \$25,000 to reopen the case. He said he understood the recent hearing at Sacramento cost approximately \$50,000.

LEAPS TO ESCAPE FROM S. F. POLICE

SAN FRANCISCO, May 3. (AP)—A fractured arm and a few bruises were the extent of injuries suffered by Walter Ott, 25, when he jumped from the third floor of an apartment house and landed on the sidewalk here today.

Ott had 33, chased by police and they surrounded his apartment door so he decided to try the jump as a method of escape. He miraculously escaped death but was picked up by officers.
