Water Barrier Plan Approved

SACRAMENTO, Calif., May 10. (UP)—Construction of Carquinez salt water barrier and the Santa Ana flood project moved a step nearer ultimate completion today when the assembly constitutional amendment committee approved the Swing-Sharkey constitutional amendment.

Dragged from the debris surrounding the collapse of the water commission program, the amendment was introduced by Senators Sharkey and Swing to save what they could of the original program.

Opposition to the amendment was presented in the committee by Assemblyman Van Bernard, but the measure was overwhelmingly approved.

Following the meeting Bernard issued a statement declaring that the Swing-Sharkey amendment was a scheme to wreck the water commission program.

FEDERAL SHOCK TROOPS DEFEAT REBEL RAIDERS

MEXICO CITY, May 10. (UP)—A dispatch to the newspaper Grafico last night told of an attack of 200 rebels on Manzanillo, state of Jalisco, where a seven hour battle was fought with the federal garrison.

The rebels were forced to retreat, the dispatch said. Four rebels dead were left on the field and a large number of wounded were carried away. The message said the rebels greatly outnumbered the federal troops and looted the village before retiring.

A report from La Prensa's correspondent at Guadalajara, Jalisco, tonight said that rebels had derailed a train at Fernandez, between Guadalajara and Manzanillo, Sinaloa, and had fought a four hour battle with the train guard. Many were reported killed, but details were not given. Passengers were not injured, it was said.

TWO HURT IN AUTO ACCIDENT

PORTLAND, May 10. (AP)—Two Portland girls were seriously injured and their two boy companions slightly hurt late last night when the stolen truck in which they were riding skidded from the road and rolled down a bank four miles south of Oregon City.

The boys were arrested and returned to Portland. One girl was in an Oregon City hospital today and the other was taken home.

Guy Kruger, 18, took a new delivery truck from a downtown street here Thursday, police say, and drove to the hotel at which he had been staying. There he picked up Randall Brown, 19. The boys then picked up Madalya Maricle, 20, and her sister, Izetia, 18.

The girls' folks live in Woodburn and the four started out for that town. Near the Doernbecker mill Kruger tried to pass a sedan and a truck. His truck skidded. The sedan driver picked the four up and took them to Oregon City.

IRRIGATING IN KLAMATH BASIN IS UNDER WAY

With the inflow half that of the peak load, irrigating on the Klamath Irrigation district is well under way and will gradually increase as the weather gets warmer, said H. D. Newell, superintendent of the Klamath re-

clamation projects, today.

"The main canal of the district is carrying about 375 second feet at this time," Mr. Newell said. "This load has been carried this week, as the result of numerous requests which were made Monday and Tuesday. The peak will probably be somewhere between 700 and 800 feet."
