## TOD MORGAN'S STABBING LEFT DEFEATS SORIO

### The Holder Outgenerals Mexican in Los Angeles Fight Last Night

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 21. (AP)—The fates which apparently have decreed that no Mexican shall hold a world's ring title have denied another challenger from that Latin-American race.

The futile attempts of Aurelio Herrera and Joe Rivers, great Mexican fighters, to ascend the thrones, there was added another today, that of Baby Sal Sario, boyish San Bernardino, Cal., ringman. Sario's quest for the junior lightweight crown was decisively repulsed here last night by Tod Morgan, slim, club-footed king of that division. Morgan won by a wide margin from the 19 year old Mexican who had flattened some 55 of his 75 opponents. The title holder rounded off with eight of the ten sessions.

Sario's challenge was repulsed to shreds by the jabbing, stabbing left hand of the champion, against which he had absolutely no defense. Morgan's long left jab found its way to Sario's head and body repeatedly keeping the Mexican's head tilted back and his weight balanced on his heels. When Sario tried to rise his short, jolting rights, he found that great weapon nailed securely to his side by the ringwise Morgan.

In two rounds, however, Baby Sal saw realization of his hopes almost come true. He took the third and eighth sessions, and had the champion in distress in both. In the third he nailed Morgan with several lefts and jarring rights and Tod went down. The champion, claiming a foul, weathered the storm, however. Again in the eighth Baby Sal had the titleholder in distress as the result of three more of his six inch rights.

However, it was plainly a case of too much experience, too much ring generalship, and too much boxing skill for the youthful, swarthy skinned challenger.

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## SLUGGERS AND BOXERS TO BE ON NEXT CARD

### Effort Made to Make Up for Poor Showing on Last Legion Program

Boxers, sluggers, fast and close little boys and hard hitting behemoths have been gathered together for the next card to be staged by Joe Fox, ticketstaff, local boxing promoter. The card will be staged at Legion Memorial hall next Friday evening and Bickersstaff in an effort to make up for the poor showing made by Frankie Forbes has lined up some of the finest boxing talent in Oregon.

A twin main event featuring Earl Heble of Portland and Jesse De Motte of Merrill, both light heavies, and Frankie Warneke, the "Flying Dutchman" against Sned Murphy, is expected to give local fans some of the best fighting witnessed here in years. De Motte is well known here as is his ability, and his opponent Heble is one of the hardest hitting boys ever developed in Portland. The Rose City lad has the reputation of being a ready mixer at all times and this hour alone is expected to send fans home with a pleasant feeling for the boxing game.

In the other half of the double bill Frankie Warneke, who meets Murphy, is known by boxing fans all over the northwest as one of the most promising writers in years. If Warneke can develop a devastating punch he will be championship lumber and fans believe that he can. Murphy is well known as a hard hitter and a boring in type of slugger.

A winner of 37 out of 39 battles, Billy Church, now of Klamath Falls, will enter the ring for a semi-windup bout against Ray Huffman of Seattle. Church is the same aggressive type of fighter as the late Harry Greb and packs a wallop in either mitt. Dancing, jabbing, hooking and slugging the local boy is a treat to watch in action and against Huffman will have to show his full line if he expects to win. Huffman has been appearing regularly on the Portland cards and is in fine shape according to his manager, Tommy Webb.

Steamboat Jackson encounters Indian Brit, the Portland Indian slugger, in a four-round setto which has no prospect of going the limit and a four-round curtain raiser in which Frankie Munroe will meet Edson, another Indian slugger, will complete the card.

## SUMMER CAMP OF BOY SCOUTS OPENS JULY 14

### Boys Will Enjoy Four Weeks Outing at Lake O'Woods

Formal opening of summer camp for boy scouts of Klamath county, has been set for Sunday, July 14th.

This year the scouts will enjoy four weeks of wilderness adventure at Lake O' Woods, where the forest service has set aside some 80 acres for camp.

A level mountain meadow fringed with evergreens and guarded by lofty Mount Pitt, offers an ideal center for camp. The camp will be located at the waters edge of Lake O' Woods. Wooded land adjoining the camp offers ideal opportunities for stalking games, woodcraft tests, pioneering and lone camping.

The cabins and tents will have their appeal. The big tents mounted high and dry on board platforms, with sides that roll back. Rustic furniture will be placed about the camp. The diving tower remains the incoming scout of the two to three swims daily under careful supervision.

The craft shop will make the scout want to get his hands on the shiny tools making a pack board sail boat model on archery equipment.

All tents will be up the first day of camp.

Scout Executive O. Hoover, in company with Paul Bunyon's construction crew will invade camp the week after Fourth of July to get the camp in readiness.

The first week of camp is scheduled from July 14 to 20; second week July 21 to 27; third week July 28 to August 3. The fourth week August 4 to 10 is for older boys who will take a skyline hike. They will enjoy a five day trip back into the mountains. The party will take all provisions in packs on their backs. About fifteen miles a day will be covered.

The fee for the first week of camp is \$7.00 with each following week \$5.00. The final week will be \$5.00.

The program at camp this season will emphasize scout advancement, good health, fellowship, practical hiking and training in water safety.

## Budd's Party Is Due Today In Rose City

PORTLAND, Ore., May 21.—Ralph Budd, president of the Great Northern railway which has brought fast passenger train service between Portland and Chicago and is now trying to put through a second north-and-south railroad on the Pacific coast, is due in Portland tonight aboard a special train that carries a group of railroad executives, financial giants and other national business figures. Mr. Budd and his party will spend most of tomorrow in Portland, going over the railroad situation here.

With the dynamic president of the Great Northern is Arthur C. Curtis James of New York, who has large interests in the Great Northern and also in the Western Pacific, which is planning with the Great Northern for the new north-and-south railroad; F. V. Weyerhaeuser, prominent lumberman; T. M. Schumaker, chairman of the board of directors of the Western Pacific, and E. E. Loonis, president of the Lewish Valley railroad. Besides, the special train carries a number of other high executives in the Great Northern.

The party is in Seattle today, leaving there late today. Their special train will arrive tonight about 9 p. m. staying over until 2 p. m. tomorrow.

## CANNIBALS OF PROVINCE EAT MANY BANDITS

### Practice of Consuming Fellow Human Beings Revealed

PEKING, May 21. (AP)—Cannibalism in the famine-stricken province of Kansu was shown to be a common practice in the report of F. Andrew, an investigator, to the China International Famine Relief commission.

Andrew said he had specially investigated many reports of cannibalism. Near Ching-Ning he found that 35 bandits had been killed and devoured by the ravenous inhabitants.

Andrew took statements from people who witnessed this and other cases. In some places, he said, the inhabitants were starving because they had no money to buy the little existing food, and in others because there was no food however much as they were willing to pay.
