COUNCIL WILL SEEK NEW BIDS FOR BUS LINE

Because franchises submitted in bids on a ten-year lease for a bus line system in Klamath Falls were not satisfactory to the city, and because the terms of the franchises asked by the different bidders were so different, it was decided to let the bids on June 10.

City Attorney Arthur Schaupp gave a report before a special adjourned meeting of the council last night, presenting the different conditions asked by each bidder.

Councilman Olds then moved that the city attorney be instructed to draw up a uniform franchise leaving the fare rate to be charged and the return to the city blank, but outlining the routes the busses must cover and the more specific conditions which the city will ask.

A copy of the franchise will be mailed to the three bidders who submitted proposals, in order that all may have a chance to bid on the same franchise. The franchise will again be advertised for bids and the bids will be opened June 10.

STECHER AGAIN FLATTENED BY "STRANGLER" ED

TULSA, Okla., May 29. (AP)—A wrestling feud between two former heavyweight champions of the world was settled here last night, for a time at least, when Ed "Strangler" Lewis, defeated Joe Stecher of Dodge City, Neb., for the third time in two years.

Stecher took the first fall with a body scissors in 20 minutes, Lewis annexed the second with a body slam in 17 minutes and the third with a double arm lock in three minutes.
