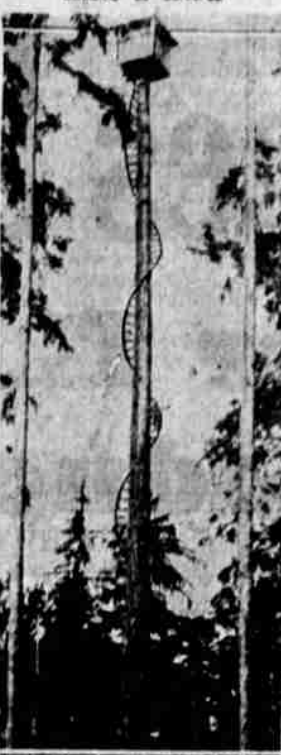
YOUNG PRINCE FINALLY DIES OF GUN WOUND

PARIS, May 30. (AP)—Prince De Sagan, 19 year old son of the former Anna Gould, died yesterday after a vain eleven day fight to recover from a bullet wound, self inflicted when his parents objected to his marrying until he was 31.

The girl for the love of whom the young prince had shot himself was not present when he died. She had not called yesterday as she had done every other day because the doctors, mindful of the patient's high fever, advised her that it would be wiser to remain away.

At his bedside when he died were his mother, his father and his half brothers, Count Boniface De Castellane, Count Georges De Castellane.

Like a Bird



Usually the forest ranger's lookout cabin is on an almost inaccessible mountaintop. But up in the Quinalt Indian reservation in Washington, the problem of safeguarding the billions of feet of Indian timber soon to be sold, was solved by perching a 10x10 foot cabin atop a 170-foot Douglas fir. After the tree was trimmed, all parts of the cabin were hoisted, piece by piece, and bolted together. Steel bars, driven into the trunk and lashed together with steel cable, form the ladder, and the forest ranger is the tiny speck about half way up the ladder.

PREDICTS DUCK DISEASE TO BE LESS SERIOUS

If present indications are a criterion, the virulent duck disease which has claimed so many thousands of game birds each year, will not be as serious this year as last.

This is the judgment of Marlon J. Barnes, district game warden, who with Earl Frey of the Dupont Powder company, and Earl Troch, Portland, visited the center of the game bird disease which is on Tule lake.

"We didn't see a sign of a sick bird," Barnes commented, "and the water is raised steadily. I do not think there will be as much disease this year as last."
