PERFECT CRIME NEAR SOLUTION

LOS ANGELES, Cal., June 1. (AP)—New facts were being ferreted out today in what Los Angeles count, authorities believed would be a speedy solution to the so-called perfect crime, the torso slaying. The discovery of blood stains in a vacant house here yesterday marked another step toward that end, investigators believed.

Investigation showed that the house had been rented the latter part of last March, by a man and woman, shortly before the body of a woman, head, arms and legs severed, was found floating in the Los Angeles river.

Mrs. Laura B. Sutton, identified by the county sheriff's office as the victim, and Dr. Frank P. Westlake, arrested two days ago in connection with the crime, are considered by officers as the pair believed to have riddled the house.

Bloodstains on the floor and a blood stained glove, similar to one found among the woman's effects, have led to the conclusion that the slaying might have occurred there.

Dr. Westlake was taken into custody after it was found that the woman's property had been recorded in his name.

Working on the theory that Mrs. Sutton was lured to the vacant house and murdered, officers said that other clues were being followed today which showed promise of further revelations concerning the case.

PHILADELPHIA JURORS FAVOR REPEAL OF LAW

PHILADELPHIA, June 1. (U P)—Compulsory American police authority with that of Russia under the Czarist regime, the Philadelphia county grand jury today advocated the repeal of the 18th amendment.

"The alarming number of arrests and the method used in making these arrests leads us to believe that the prohibition amendment is not only an unpopular and undesirable law, but also one which is detrimental to the liberties of the people guaranteed by the constitution," said the jury in its final presentation.

Pointing to the number of liquor raids made without warrants, it added "we are in danger of becoming subjected to police authority to an extent approximating that of the people of Russia under the Czaristic regime."
