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EXPLAINS WHAT REALTOR MEANS

Code of Ethics Must Be Adhered to By Real Estate Men

What the name "Realtor" stands for is explained in an interview with Dugan Dale of Dale and Hosking.

"All real estate brokers who become members of the board are obliged to uphold a Code of Ethics which has been drawn by the National Association of Real Estate Boards. The boards also have compiled a standard schedule of commissions which are believed to be a fair compensation for the effort of the broker, and these have been adopted by the courts as a standard. The board also maintains an Arbitration committee which endeavors to adjust complaints preferred against members," Mr. Dale explained.

"A member of a Realty Board may be recognized by his use of the title 'Realtor'. This title is not available to all real estate brokers as it is a word coined and copyrighted by the National Association of Real Estate

boards. The exclusive right of board members to its use has been secured by numerous court decisions in many states. The real estate commissioner also considers its unauthorized use as misrepresentation and basis for revoking of licenses."

Annual meeting of the local Realty Board was held on Monday evening with state officials in attendance.
