

BOOZE RUNNERS MOBILIZE FOR BIG OFFENSIVE

Border Patrol Strengthened for Expected Movement of Liquor

WASHINGTON, June 18, (AP)—A distant Secretary Lowman announced today that confidential reports from treasury agents indicated an unprecedented gathering of bootleggers and smugglers along the Canadian border from Vancouver to the Atlantic seaboard to smuggle liquor into the United States.

Because of this he said the customs border patrol across the entire country had been strengthened.

Lowman also said President Hoover had not asked for any report concerning the smuggling or prohibition enforcement situation and that he had not conferred or made any report to the executive.

The White House, he said, had transmitted to him a telegram of Minnesota citizens protesting against the killing of Henry Virkula by Customs Border Patrol men.

Besides this 150 other telegrams both protesting against and approving the treasury stand, he added, had been received on this case.

Lowman declared there was nothing that could be done at this time about the protest and that the case would be allowed to take its usual course in the courts.

SCHOOL EDITOR DISMISSED FOR OBSCENE POEM

Discover Immorality of Hymn After It Was Sung at Baccalaureate

BOSTON, June 18, (AP)—Edward Fitzhugh, of Boise, Idaho, author of the Harvard College senior class hymn and prominent in student literary affairs, who was to have been graduated with his class Thursday, has been dismissed from the college, it was learned today. College authorities declined to comment on the case.

Fitzhugh, who was an editor of the Harvard Advocate, a student monthly, was dismissed because of an anagram, of immortality came at the height of the commencement week activities which were ushered in with a baccalaureate program Sunday which included the singing of Fitzhugh's hymn.

The hymn, a work of four verses of four lines each, contained sacred sentiment. It was discovered after the baccalaureate service, however, that it had been written in the form of an anagram, which in the first letters of the 16 lines were read downward, spelled out four obscene words.

ening gale. He wore a life belt.

Captain Johnson yesterday rejected the appeals of coast guardsmen that he leave his wrecked ship at the time his crew departed. He shouted to them that he would not leave. Coast guardsmen at 11 sailors declared Johnson believed the bulk would drift ashore and that salvage would be possible.

If he left the ship, they said, the first to board her could claim the prize.

A broken prize it was, however, with the ship cut in two pieces, the stern lying 500 feet from the bow. The captain was on the stern of the wreck.

In the face of the storm that was rising over the coastline, seamen and life savers thought Captain Johnson might have a change of heart and that he would now be more than willing to leave the ship.

It would be several hours, though, before another opportunity for departure presented itself.

The coast guardsmen at Cape Lookout declared they could not possibly venture toward the Laurel until 5 p. m. when the tide would be at its lowest.

Extension of National Forest Area Proposed in Butler Bill

LAKEVIEW, Ore., June 17.—Provisions for the addition of more than 100,000 acres of timberlands in northern Lake county to the Fremont National forest is contained in a bill introduced in the House of Representatives by Representative Robert M. Butler Thursday afternoon. The addition to forest lands will serve to block up the northern section of the Fremont forest and result in easier and more economical administration of the entire area. The bill is destined to pass both the House and the Senate when it comes for consideration.

The present forest boundaries present numerous detached areas, many of them a section or less in area and these are spread over a wide area in the northwestern corner of the county. Supervisor Gilbert Brown stated this morning. Blocking up of the entire area will assist materially in the administration of that section of the forest. The new boundaries embraced in the bill extend the area to meet the boundaries of the Klamath Indian reservation on the south and those of the Deschutes forest on the west and north. The eastern boundary is not affected in the proposed change.

The project has been actively sponsored by the cattlemen's association of both Silver Lake and Paisley and the progress made in the matter by Representative Butler is meeting with the hearty approval of these associations.

The new area proposed contains a heavy stand of lodge pole pine and while the timber at this time is regarded of small commercial value, it is anticipated that in future years its value may be greatly increased when utilization methods have been worked out. As it now stands, the lodge pole constitutes a fire menace for the various areas of yellow pine which it surrounds and its inclusion in the forest area will permit proper safeguards being set up for the protection of the more valuable timber.
