ACTORS, MOVIES BEGIN BATTLE

NEW YORK, June 17 (UP)—The long-expected "battle of the movies" began today with a boom.
 The Actors' Equity association fired the first gun and claimed victory in the first skirmish of the war to unionize actors in the talking pictures as those of the legitimate stage have been unionized.
 A manifesto, issued from the equity headquarters tonight announced that Pedro de Cordoba, legitimate stage actor, had prevented the filming of "On the Stairs" by Pathe by refusing to report for work under open shop conditions.
 De Cordoba, the statement admitted, was the only actor to walk out in the production, but since he had been cast for the leading part, the action was sufficiently serious to hamper the picture.
