SULPHIDE GAS KILLS FIFTEEN

EL PASO, Tex., June 20, (UP)—At least 15 persons were overcome and two children were killed by gas fumes in a settlement five miles east of here tonight. Horses, dogs and chickens were found dead in barnyards. The community is within a few hundred feet of two oil refineries and doctors at a hospital to which the victims were rushed said indications were they had been overcome by escaping hydrogen sulphide gas.

W. G. Hamilton, manager of the oil refinery reported four hours after the first cases had been discovered that he was unable to find deadly gas in the neighborhood although employing an indicator. Just as he finished his tests additional calls for ambulances came from a valley home two miles east of the community where the first persons were overcome.
