THREE KILLED AS PLANE HITS TENSION WIRES

MONTREAL, June 21. (AP.)—The waters of the St. Lawrence river were being searched today for the body of C. S. Caldwell, a pilot for Canadian Vickers, Ltd.

Caldwell, Captain J. C. Jervis, former aide de camp to the governor-general of Canada, and Dr. William D. Morris, were killed yesterday when a seaplane, piloted by Caldwell, struck a span of high tension wires and plunged into the river.

The bodies of Captain Jervis and Dr. Morris were recovered.

Witnesses said the plane was flying on the river at low altitude when it reached a point between St. Charles and Nun's Island. There was a flash of flame as the plane struck two wires carrying power from the city to Nun's Island and the aircraft fell into the water, overturning as it struck.
