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MARRIED LIFE OF STAR AND AVIATOR ENDS

LOS ANGELES, June 22, (A P)—Pricilla Dean, motion picture actress and Leslie P. Arnold, former army aviator, were following separate paths today, but the roads will lead to remarriage, they contend.
