

Changes Are Made In City Auto Parking Ordinance

A revised ordinance was passed by the city council Monday night to provide for the manner of parking and regulate the time and signs. This called for the repeal of ordinance No. 1072 and all parts thereof dealing with the same subject.

Under the new ordinance the city council will provide for the manner of parking within the city limits, regulate the time in the business sections of the city, provide parking, stops, no reverse turn, no parking, and other regulatory signs which will be placed on the curb.

No Night Parking

Between the hours of 8 a. m. and 6 p. m. the parking limit on Main street between Second and Fifth will be one hour. Thirty minutes' time will be the limit

between the busy sections from Fifth to Esplanade, one hour on Klamath avenue between Fourth and Eleventh and one hour limit on all cross streets of Klamath and Pine between Fourth and Eleventh streets. Night parking will be strictly prohibited on all streets in the city between the hours of 1 a. m. and 4 a. m.

No objections having been filed on the proposed assessment roll, the city council is authorized to draw up an ordinance ordering the leveling of the assessment on the 12th and 13th sewer units. City Attorney A. W. Schaupp will draw up the ordinance, which will be presented at the next meeting.

NEED BOXES AS SEATS FOR BIG INDIAN PARADE

Merchants located on both sides of Main street from Fourth to Ninth streets were today requested by Alfred Collier, commander of the American Legion, to save their boxes, kegs or any other merchandise container that could be used as a seat during the Fourth of July-Indian Congress parade.

Five lumber companies have agreed to loan long boards, two by twelve, which will be laid on top of boxes to provide comfortable temporary seats during the parade. The Lakeside Lumber company will provide boards from Fourth to Fifth; Swan Lake Moulding company, Fifth to Sixth; Drake Lumber company, Sixth to Seventh; Sixth Street Lumber company, Seventh to Eighth and Big Basin Lumber company Eighth to Ninth.

Work On 9th Street Block Is Under Way

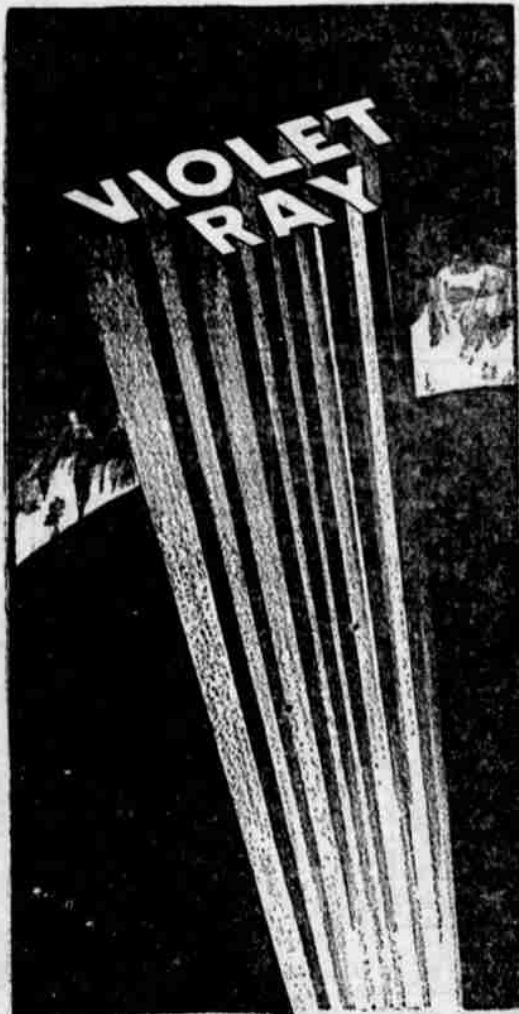
That work on the federal building site will not be under way before February 1930 was the word received today by Postmaster John A. McCall from the Treasury Department at Washington, D. C.

In a letter from H. G. Sherwood, executive officer of the Treasury Department Mr. McCall was informed that because of the great amount of public building work now before the department it is estimated that the site will not be put into use by the department until early in 1930.

"However this present program may be changed, but as yet no definite assurance in his respect can be given," Mr. Sherwood stated.

Directors of the chamber of commerce along with business men and civic organizations of the city intend to keep the necessity of rushing construction on the new building before the Treasury Department through senators and representatives in Congress.
