AMERICAN BOAT SELLS LIQUORS

Leviathan Dispenses Booze on East and West Trips.

NEW YORK, June 27. (AP)—The New York Herald-Tribune said today that liquor is now being sold aboard the United States liner Leviathan on both east and west bound voyages.

The source of supply for the last eastward trip was unknown, but the newspaper said it was learned when the ship docked here yesterday that there was enough liquor on hand to put the bartenders to work in first, second and tourist sections.

Passengers said cocktails were available before meals, the best of wines at moderate prices at the dining tables and anything except beer after or between meals. On previous trips since the United States Lines, Inc., took over the Leviathan from the shipping board liquor was sold only on the westward trip. The Herald-Tribune said the only explanation for the presence of the liquor was that the medical stores were being used as has been the practice on other American ships sailing to foreign ports.
