

COAST HOLDS FATE OF RACE SAYS WILBUR

Secretary of Interior Addresses Large Audience in San Francisco.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 28, (U. P.)—The fate of the human family is going to be played out on the Pacific, Secretary of the Interior Ray Lyman Wilbur told the national association of social work, in his address here last night.

"We cannot depend on human emotions alone if we are to have a safe world," he said. "We must have the facts. There is no more human problem than this problem of the Pacific. There is no more important problem."

The emotions have played too important a part in affairs, he said. The history of the Pacific is to be one of peace, Americans must see themselves as others see them—they must think in the terms of the people of the orient.

"Don't forget we start with some handicaps," he continued, speaking extemporaneously. "We are not the cocks of the walk, by any means."

To some foreign peoples who appear strange to Americans, the American is much like a comic Sunday supplement, the secretary said. He advocated intensive co-operative study of the Pacific conditions, problems and peoples like that which is being carried on by the Institute of Pacific Relations.

The secretary described briefly the advancement of the oriental nations and their social welfare achievements.
