INDIAN POLICY IS CRITICISED

(Continued from page One) tribal funds are used for these purposes without the expressed consent of the Indians, it is done arbitrarily purporting to be to the best interests of the Indians. Philanthropy is a wonderful thing but not many American people will consent to having it thrust upon them. The situation is an un-American form of Socialism which certainly has no place in the scheme of things in our government.

vious to this the Dawes Act (224 Stat. L. 334) and the Burke Act (34 Stat. L. 182) had conferred citizenship upon the American Indians and declared them subject to State and Territorial Law. In accordance with this law the Klamath Indians have been subjected to the state law.

The definition of citizenship in the statutes of the United States, sees quite clearly that "any person born within the United States or its territories and subject to state and territorial law is subject to all the rights, privileges and immunities of citizen regardless of race or previous condition of servitude."

The Supreme Court held that, "Wardship and Guardianship were not incompatible with tribal relations or continued guardianship and so may be conferred without emancipating the Indians or placing them beyond the reach of Congressional regulation adopted for their protection."

The situation is anomalous. It is pretending to something that it is not. It is neither protecting the Indian nor his property but in the meantime it is endeavoring to make the American public and the congress believe that this so called Guardianship is a protection.

Not one word should be said against the situation, if it were doing as it is pretending to do, if it were educating the Indian, protecting and conserving his property, teaching him industry and thrift; but instead it has created a situation that is deteriorating the standard of the Indian youth today. The Indian boys and girls of this reservation have been taught to believe they belong in the class of the IDLE RICH.

Shocking to Wear Clothes, Says Strange Cult; Police of Paris Insist, However

By MINOTT SAUNDERS NEA Service Writer PARIS, June 28.—Life is not all that it should be on the island of Villennes in the Seine. By order of the prefect of police, the folks there have to wear too many clothes to suit them. The men must wear at least a loin-cloth, and the women some sort of a bathing suit.

"Nudity Isle," but the enthusiasts are irked by the official restraint and have sworn to "abjure this grotesque and noxious adornment."

Those Interfering Cops! Otherwise the nudist movement is growing daily and Dr. Andre Durville, who is in charge of the Villennes "school," claims to have 29,000 followers. They have bought the island and by the end of the summer hope to have it laid out as a nudist park. The only difficulty is that the police refused to let them disport themselves completely nude, as German nudists are allowed to do.

An Envoy of Nudism Dr. Hugo Zimmerman, one of the leaders of the nude movement in Germany, has been in Paris to encourage his French colleagues and stimulate nudism here.

"You have no idea of the moral revolution brought about in the human being by nudism," he said. "I believe that humanity can only be saved from evil by the practice of complete naturalism. I also believe that this regeneration must be international. I come to Paris to work for peace among men and this can best be achieved by naturalism." The cult of nudism, though comparatively new to France, is

reported to have more than three million members in Germany. European leaders of the movement have declared the wearing of clothes as "unhealthy and unnatural" and claim that living in an unclothed state would free mankind of most of its ills.

France had its first introduction to the nudism movement not long ago when another luring back-to-nature colony was established on the outskirts of Paris. It was organized something after the manner of an exclusive country club—its members, men and women, meeting three times a week, quite unclothed, to engage in innocent sports.
