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FOUR SPANISH FLYERS GIVEN BIG RECEPTION

Heroes of Ill-Starred Ocean Flight Greeted at Gibraltar

GIBRALTAR, July 2, (AP)—Bearing a story of quiet heroism and patience in the face of death, Major Ramon Franco and his three companions of their ill-starred "Trans-Atlantic flight," landed at Gibraltar from the rescue ship H. M. S. Eagle today, safe, sound and still able to laugh happily.

Along the streets and waterfronts in all directions were thousands who had come to see them and cheer their lives of deliverance after a week's floating in the Atlantic in the region of the Azores.

Huge Crowds
Crowds and demonstrations such as the military flared Gibraltar has never known greeted the four men. Traffic was stalled and newspapermen almost literally had to fight their way every foot through the streets while launches in the harbor had difficulty in getting to and from

the Eagle. All the British population of Gibraltar had turned out and there were between ten and fifteen thousand spectators who came across from Spain.

Major Franco and his companions Major Eduardo Gonzalez Gallarza, Captain Julio Ruiz de Alda and mechanic Pedro Madariaga remained aboard the Eagle until almost eleven o'clock when they came ashore in launches and proceeded to government house where they were formally received by Governor Sir Alexander Godley and Rear Admiral Berwick Curtis, commanding the British Gibraltar naval force.

They thanked the governor and the admiral for their rescue by the British aircraft carrier and then in staccato, accompanied by Spanish officials proceeded to the nearby Spanish towns of La Linea and Algeciras.
