

FIVE HELD ON DRUNKEN AUTO DRIVING COUNT

Several Enter Pleas of Guilty; Others to Fight Charges.

Charged with driving automobiles while intoxicated, five men were brought before Police Judge U. S. Ballentine this morning.

R. E. Reginato, arrested on South Sixth entered a plea of guilty to the charge and was fined \$100. He paid the fine and was released from the city jail.

Arvid Carlson, whose arrest was made by city officers on South Sixth also entered a plea of guilty to the charge of driving while drunk. Paying a fine of \$100 imposed by the Judge, Carlson was released.

M. Martin, arrested between Third and Fourth on Main street, charged with driving while intoxicated entered a plea of not guilty. His case will come before Police Judge Ballentine tomorrow.

P. M. Murphy, arrested on East Main was given until Saturday morning to enter his plea.

Duke Wilber, arrested at 745 Plumb street will enter his plea Monday morning at 9 o'clock.

Joe Murphy, alleged bootlegger, recently released from the city jail where he served out a sentence for possession was found guilty of breaking glass on Eleventh and Klamath. Not able to furnish \$50 to pay the fine imposed by the Judge, Murphy was sent to jail.

Edris Smith and Harry Brown, both arrested for disturbing the peace were fined \$15 or seven days in the city jail. Smith paid his fine and was released. Brown was sent to jail when he found it impossible to raise the money. The two were arrested by city officers at the rear of the A. and R. root beer stand where they were fighting.

Forty men appeared in police court this morning, charged with being drunk. Few were able to pay the fines imposed and were sent to jail.

"Cells of the city jail are almost filled with men, arrested for driving while drunk, possession of intoxicating liquor and being drunk," Keith Ambrose, chief of police told a Herald reporter.

"Too much whoopee over the Fourth of July," the chief concluded.
