## COCHET BEATS JEAN BOROTRA TO WIN TITLE

### Bounding Basque Overwhelmed in Three Straight Sets.

WIMBLEDON, England, July 6. (AP)—Henri Cochet of France won the British tennis championship today by defeating his countryman, Jean Borotra, in the final match.

Cochet overwhelming the bounding Basque to win straight sets by scores of 6-4, 6-3, 6-4. Cochet, who won the same title in 1927, captured the crown this year in one of the most impressive displays of tennis ever seen on the courts of Wimbledon. Bill Tilden and Borotra, two of the greatest players of the day, were smothered by him in three straight sets, the American getting but ten games and the Basque but 11.

Little Henri also holds the American championship won last fall.

**The Situation:** Making an approach shot to the green, or in making a putt, you find your ball wedged between the lip of the cup and the flag stick, which is still in the hole. What rule applies?

**The Rule Is:** If your ball rests against a flag stick, which is still in the hole, you may remove the flag stick. Should your ball fall into the hole you shall be considered to have holed out on your last stroke.

## WILSON FINED AND SUSPENDED BY PRESIDENT

### Attack During Recent Game Brings Swift Punishment.

NEW YORK, July 6. (AP)—Lewis (Hack) Wilson, slugging outfielder of the Chicago Cubs must pay a fine of \$100, and serve a suspension of three days, effective today, for his attempted attack upon Ray Kolp in the Reds' dugout during the game at Chicago July 4, President Heydler of the National league announced today.

In advising Wilson by wire of his punishment, President Heydler said: "Whatever your provocation may have been, you were not justified in leaving your base during the game to take the law into your own hands. Your actions might easily have started a riot."

Wilson, reeling taunts flung at him by Kolp from the bench, left first base to rush at his tormentor, according to Manager Hendricks of the Reds. Wilson failed to reach Kolp but there was a general scuffle about the bench. Wilson's later action in punching Pete Donohue, Cincinnati pitcher, as they were boarding a train, did not enter into the decision of President Heydler.

## ACCIDENT FATAL TO LANE COUNTY FARMER

EUGENE, Ore., July 6. (AP)—Peter Vengelen, 34, farmer, injured when his car crashed over a 75-foot cliff on the Sialaw road, died last night in a Eugene hospital. Mrs. Vengelen and a daughter, both in the hospital following the plunge, are expected to recover.

## KLEIN'S HOMER DEFEATS CARDS

### Philadelphia Americans Move Towards Another Pennant.

Guns were spiked generally all along the baseball front yesterday as the major league armies moved into position for another series of intersectional battles, but the Cardinals found time to lose their tenth straight while waiting for the other teams to swing into action. The champions were accommodated yesterday by nobody but the Phillies, who obligingly dropped 20 out of 22 to St. Louis last year.

Jess Haines made as if to slip a fast one past Charlie Klein, first Philadelphia batsman in the tenth inning, after Master Klein had refused to bite at two wide hooks. The fast one was just to Klein's liking, and he drove it high over the right field wall of Baker bowl to give the Phils a 10 to 8 decision. It was his 20th home run, and enabled him to keep pace with Chick Hafey of St. Louis, who picked up his own 20th earlier in the game.

The Cardinals will remain in Philadelphia for a full series, and the Cubs will invade the citadel of the Braves today, but the rest of the intersectional openings will be delayed until tomorrow. The Reds, who hold the Giants in no awe, will come to the Polo grounds for two games on the Sabbath after a farewell brush with Pittsburgh today, and the fast moving Pirates will settle themselves at Ebbets field, Brooklyn will entertain at the Polo grounds today.

As the Pirates and the Cubs give each other heart failure in the dash toward the National league stretch, Cornelius McGillycuddy moves serenely toward his seventh flag.

## PRIVATE HEARING FOR FINKE IS CONDUCTED

PORTLAND, Ore., July 6. (AP)—A private hearing for Walter Finke, 16, who shot and killed Herbert Beem in the corridor of a high school May 29, was under way in the court of domestic relations today with Judge Gilbert on the bench. The affections of a 16 year old high school girl were involved in the slaying.

The hearing will complete the Judge's investigation of the case. Finke is temporarily a ward of juvenile court.

## AIR ENDURANCE RECORD SET BY TWO AVIATORS

### In Air 174 Hours and 59 Seconds; Nearly Meet Disaster.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, July 6. (AP)—Holders of a new world's record for endurance flights of 174 hours and 59 minutes, pilots Roy L. Mitchell and Byron K. Newcomb today rested their weary bodies after remaining in the air from a week ago Friday afternoon until 12:39:59 this morning. They brought their plane to earth at Cleveland airport.

They exceeded by one hour, 23 minutes and 59 seconds the old mark set recently in Fort Worth, Texas, by Reginald Robbins and James Kelley, who remained aloft 172 hours, 32 minutes and 1 second.

Weariness brought the airmen to a landing and the riotous acclaim of 75,000 persons after a flight while' became more hazardous and difficult as the days slotted cut down their physical endurance.

The climax of the attempt came but a few hours before it ended, and the two men said it nearly killed them. They survived a severe electrical storm which damaged their refueling plane in a forced landing and stopped all other air traffic to fight on for the record, attained twelve hours later.

Exhausted, the airmen immediately were taken under guard to a hotel, to sleep throughout the day if they desire. They were spent. "We broke the record, that's enough. All we want now is sleep," Newcomb said.

## MODOC COUNTY PROTECTS FISH

### Game Commission Official Commends California Residents.

ALTURUS, Cal., July 6.—That Modoc county is giving better cooperation in the matter of the conservation of fish by the installation of fish ladders and fish screen and in preventing the pollution of streams than any other section of the state was the opinion of John Spencer, official of the fish and game commission who visited here a few days ago in the interest of this work.

Spencer said that he had been given a splendid reception by the people of the county, and that in every case he had met with willingness to assist in preserving the fish in streams and lakes.

A number of land owners were interviewed by the state official in company with A. A. Jorda deputy fish and game commissioner for this district, and a large number of fish screens will be placed as a result of their conferences. Only one case of pollution was found in the county, and it was speedily remedied.
