KING GEORGE'S LUNG TROUBLE SERIOUS AGAIN

LONDON, July 11. (AP)—King George, suffering from a relapse in the condition of the old left lung incision, was said authoritatively at Buckingham palace today to have passed a comfortable night.

General concern prevailed today in Britain for the welfare of the monarch, whose projected visit to the summer palace at Sandringham was postponed suddenly yesterday.

Physicians' explanations that the sinus in the left lung had shown unsatisfactory progress.

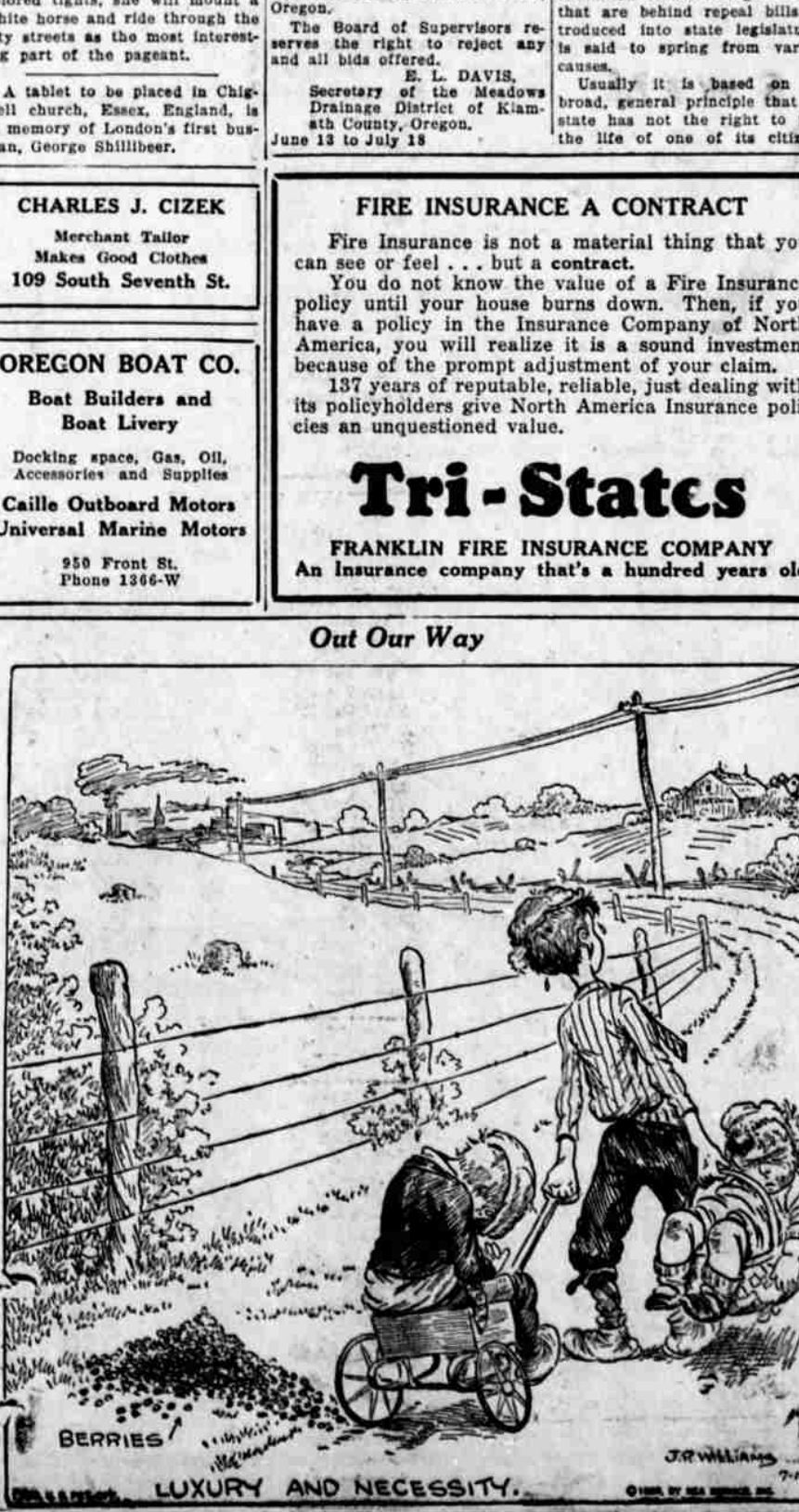
