SPRINTERS OF AMERICA WILL INVADE CANADA

Objective is to Defeat Percy Williams, Olympic Champion.

SPRINTERS of Sports ... (By FRANK G. GORRIE) (Associated Press Sports Writer) VANCOUVER, B. C., July 12. (AP)—America's greatest sprinters, with one or two exceptions, had invaded the domain of Percy Williams, Olympic champion, today to attempt to conquer the only undefeated well-known 100-yard dash star in the world in the greatest track and field meet ever held on the Pacific coast.

Williams, a slightly built youth of 21, who won world fame when he captured the 100 and 200 meter dashes at the Olympic games in Amsterdam last year, hoped to thrust aside the challenger of Eddie Tolan, "Midnight Express" Frank Wykoff, Claude Bracy, John Fitzpatrick, M. Maurer, W. Scott, Wesley Foster, and many others in the two-day mid-summer carnival and grand amateur athletic meet in Vancouver today and tomorrow. George Simpson, "world's fastest human," had planned to match strides with the brilliant Olympic flash, but pulled a tendon in the national collegiate track and field meet in Chicago a few weeks ago and was forced to withdraw from the Canadian games.

Approximately 125 athletes, including several British Columbia Indians were scheduled to compete in the carnival which has attracted many of the greatest men and women stars in the United States and Canada. The preliminaries were to get under way at 5 p. m. today with the finals scheduled for tomorrow afternoon.
