## Fireworks Display to Feature Evenings of Elks Convention; Amazing Effects are Planned

Fireworks have always had a great appeal to the public at large because of the inherent characteristic within the human race, namely, the love of fire and flame.

As a special feature of the Oregon State Elks convention the Hitt Fireworks Company of Seattle are preparing a magnificent spectacle of pyrotechnic accomplishments. Another effect to be used is a spectacular Aerial Cloudburst, where gold flaming fire is poured into the clouds.

Not less brilliant is the dazzling array of pyrotechnics displayed from the ground. A great variety of peculiar devices will display their gorgeous showers of sparks and rain of silver and gold into the arena.

The chemistry of fireworks is one which awakens the enthusiasm of the experimenter and the genius of the devices that are made possible by the creative chemistry of the age, are remarkable and awe-inspiring.

Dating back to the early time of Greek fire and to the explosions created by the Chinese people to ward off the evil spirits, the imaginative and creative mind of man has worked through the fields of chemistry to produce marvelous things in fire illumination. All of the most attractive effects are to be witnessed here.

As the various elements of the earth burn, they produce each their own distinctive color and so the object of the fireworks expert is to combine the metallic flaming beauty of the land of chemical combination and present them in a blazing spectacle before the eyes of astonished spectators.

A gigantic display of all of the modern achievements in the pyrotechnic art will be presented at the State Elks Convention, July 17 to 20, by the Hitt Fireworks Company of Seattle, Washington.

## Modoc County City Building Up Very Fast

ALTURAS, Calif., July 13.—(Special)—A two and one-half million dollar building program is under way here. Structures under completion consist of residences, business blocks and public edifices.

One hundred and fifty homes are in various stages of construction, ranging from foundation work to moving in of furniture, while fine new business blocks are covering former vacant lots or replacing more modest structures. Much remodeling work is also being done.

**Erect Bell Building**

Among the new units is the Bell building. This is concrete and steel structure, two stories high and plans call for its being used for stores and offices. It is located at Main and Second streets. It is costing \$40,000.

The Helms building at the corner on Main street has been put up at an outlay of \$30,000 and is also of the C class type, wherein concrete and steel are used. It has one story and provides accommodations for a department store.

At Modoc and First streets the Aravolad building is under way. Like the others, it is of the C type. It is being erected at a cost of \$25,000 and is being partitioned off into three store-rooms.

**Build Gymnasium**

A new gymnasium is being added to the high school building group at an expenditure to the district of \$48,000. It is about one-third completed but will be finished in time for fall school opening.

The big W. C. Garrett block fronting on Main, Modoc and Howard streets is undergoing remodeling to the extent of \$45,000, while contractors are about ready to start on the new Masonic temple, which will cost \$45,000.

**New Theater Open**

Henry Heber of Sacramento has his new Alhambra theater open to the public. It is an all-talkie movie and was built at an expenditure of \$17,500, having a seating capacity for 700 patrons.

The Modoc hotel has undergone remodeling and the lodging space increased by 20 rooms. Dr. T. J. Halloran is expending \$10,000 on the structure.

Niles hotel was recently sold to Oscar Peterson of Ogdén, Utah, and C. M. Linden of Rock Springs, Wyo. The deal involved \$73,000 cash.

The new owners contemplate

a new annex to cost \$125,000. According to those who were made acquainted with the plans, the new addition to the Niles will be the last word in up-to-date hostleries that can be built.

A new building costing several thousand dollars now houses the U. S. French laundry, in which has been installed \$8,000 worth of the latest laundry equipment.

**Paper Is Semi-Weekly**

The Alturas semi-weekly Plain Dealer has just moved into a new home that far surpasses in appearance the general run of newspaper plants. It is a stucco building designed along pleasing lines. The owners have a Goss Comet press and operate with two linotypes.

The weekly Modoc Times is a new paper here and the owners who came here from Lakeview are doing well with their publication.

**Double Water Supply**

A new city well was just finished, doubling the available water supply. The last flow stands a U. C. test of 98.2 per cent pure, giving Alturas water that can always be relied on as healthful.

A bond issue of \$50,000 has recently been voted for adding to the present sewer system while two new water mains are being put down.

One traverses Fourth street and the other follows Fourth street, while 1,000 feet of main connects with one of the nearby fast growing subdivisions.

## Malin Concern Is Ready for Wheat Harvest

MALIN, Ore., July 13.—(Special)—With an elevator holding 17,000 bushels of grain attached to the Malin rolling mill located here, this section is again prepared to take care of the large annual wheat crop this fall, said A. Petrasek, miller in charge, yesterday.

The annual production in this part of Lost river valley is from 500,000 to 800,000 bushels but much of the output is shipped out of the valley.

Wheat in this section yields from 40 to 60 bushels to the acre while barley runs from 50 to 75 bushels to the acre. This season gives promise of another fine crop.

The hard wheat grown here mills into some of the best flour obtainable. The Valley Queen brand, manufactured at Malin and Klamath Falls works up into very nutritious and palatable bread, that is much sought after by bakers and consumers.

Officers of the Malin Roller Mill company are A. Kallna, president; M. M. Stamsney, secretary; the plant here is well equipped and is four stories high.

From the lofty towers a superb view of the country may be seen. The valley appears in every direction as level as a dancing floor.

The farmers are all busy with their summer crazy quilt patchwork, and the resu is a giant bed spread with splashes of gorgeous gree blending into yellows, all croceted out in growing crops.
