Population of Alturas Shows Big Increase

ALTURAS, Calif., July 12.—(Special)—Jump: from a population of 1,250 in July, 1928, the present post office estimate of the number of people here is about 4,000, but Harry Coleman, secretary of the chamber has toned the figure down to 3,500.

This city is the county seat of Modoc county and has an assessed valuation of 1,200,000. The bank clearings are \$100,000 daily which includes outside items. The school capacity is 300 students in the grades and 250 in the high school. Great business growth, building of 150 new homes, and other developments are under way.

From the mountain valley dairy 4,000 pounds of butter are shipped daily to the cities in the bay region, principally to Oakland, and this commerce is bringing in large weekly pay checks to the farmers of this county.

The huge stanzas of timber with the railroad mileage and the general valuation makes this a very wealthy county and after the section becomes adjusted, following the present rapid development, the tax rate for all property owners will be low, making Modoc county in the neighborhood of Alturas an ideal place for new settlers to locate.
