

City Dressed in Purple And White for Convention

Purple and white windows are all the vogue in town, all dressed up for the Elks' convention which opened this morning. These decorations, together with the hats which all the "Bills" are wearing and the street decorations give the town a colorful and festive tone.

A natural setting has been placed in the window at the Pelican Grille, where Jack Herberger presides. Jack lets them know that they are all welcome with a huge sign placed in the window, reading "Welcome, Bill. Good pasture if you want to browse."

A large elk has been shipped in from Bend, where it stood in the Elks temple in that city and, has been placed in a prominent position in Lloyd Magill's drug store on Main street. It stands nearly ten feet high and certainly none of the Elks can fail to visit Magill's when such an invitation is offered. Purple and white streamers also decorate the lights and windows.

One of the most beautiful of windows is seen at Moe's store, where white articles are displayed against a purple background and welcome signs placed.

Probably the most interesting is that of the Pelican Drug company advertising headache cures. A large barrel is placed in the center of the window and is surrounded by bromo seltzer bottles and aspirin packages. This extends a welcome to the visiting Elks from J. L.
