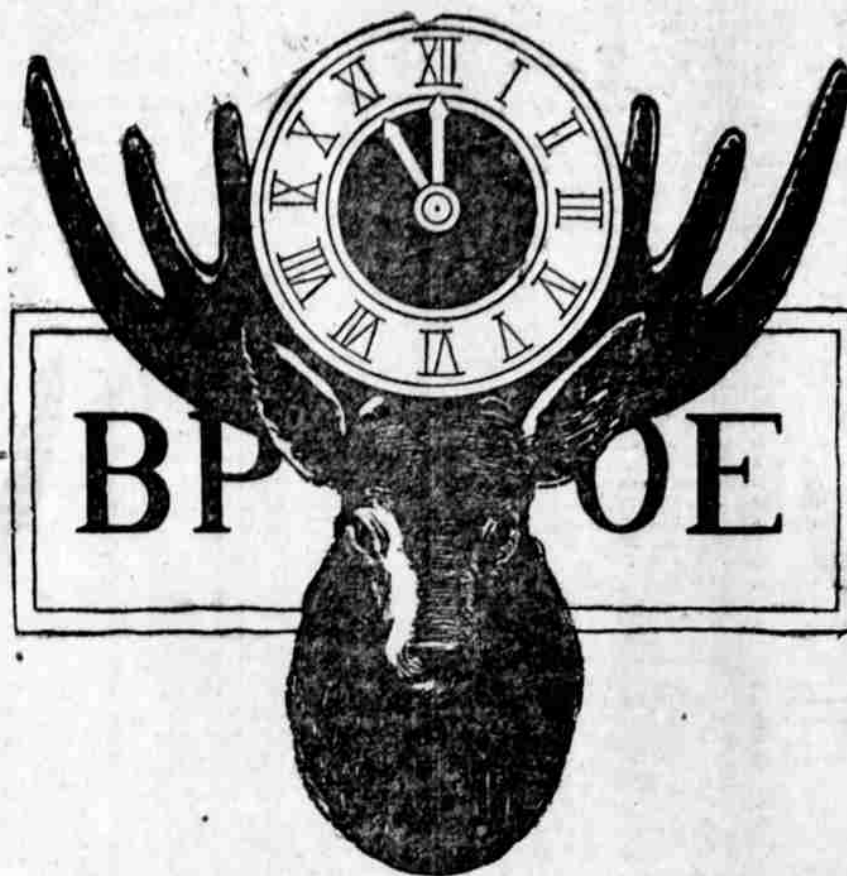


KLAMATH FALLS GREETES ELKS
